Some meets like the Mustang Relays at Shenandoah (started in 1947) were discontinued for a few years in the late 1980s before being revived. The Bluejay Relays at Villisca was started in 1954 but dropped in 2003. The Crest Relays at Creston were started in 1945 and had a 45 year run ending in 1990 when Classes 3A and 2A voted to go to season qualifying for the state meet. Creston's Panther Relays has been run since 1974. Fort Madison Relays were started in 1930 and ran consecutively through 1994 when several participating schools' went to regular season qualifying to the state meet.

Because of school consolidations, meets going co-ed or re-naming, a meet may have changed slightly but should not cause it to be removed from consideration.

The University of Iowa held an "open invitational state meet" starting in the mid 1890's through the 1920s.

The 115th IHSAA State Track & Field Championships, started in 1906, will be contested May 21-23, 2020 as part of the 16th Annual Iowa Track & Field Championships, which includes boys and girls divisions.

* Years the meet was scheduled –some years weather caused interruptions or cancellations Notes: Prairie View (Gowrie)/Ryan Relays (started as the Vi-Queen Relays) and Blackhawkette Relays (Emerson-Nishna Valley - 1960 – ran at Red Oak in the beginning). Those meets were started along with the Anita-Wiota Relays and Rockette Relays at Paton-Churdan in 1960. The latter two and others started in the early 1960s have since been discontinued. <u>We continue to look for</u> current meets that have been in existence for 40 or more years.

Some of the above meets may have been cancelled in some years due to weather.

The lowa Girls' State Track & Field Meet was held for the first time in 1962 at Pleasantville, making the 2020 Championships the IGHSAU's 59th Annual State Meet, May 21-23. It is now part of the 16th Annual State and Field Championships which includes girls and boys divisions.
