### **MISSION**

"The Iowa High School Athletic Association serves its member schools and students by providing leadership and support for education based interscholastic athletics that enrich the educational experience of the student athlete."

### **PURPOSE**

"To promote, develop, direct, protect, and regulate amateur interscholastic athletic relationships between member schools and to stimulate fair play, friendly rivalry, and good sportsmanship among contestants, schools, and communities throughout the state."

### INTRODUCTION

Changes in this Stat Book continue to be made. Users should note the date of new material and information on the cover. Additional information that was previously omitted, in error, or incomplete has been resolved and is included. Iowa's high school baseball legacy is proud and extensive. It includes the Spring State Tournament from 1928 through 1972; the State Fall Championships from 1939 to 1985, and the Summer State Championships since 1946. The 2018 Summer Championships will be the 74th consecutive year for Summer Baseball and the 92nd year for the sport overall. The longevity, the number of participants, and the level of play, coaching and umpiring constitutes a remarkable testimonial to all those who have made high school baseball "prime time."

From 1946 through 2018 we have crowned 195 Summer State Champions. A total of 129 different coaches have directed teams to State Titles. Just as impressively, 556 coaches have directed teams to the Summer State Tournament with 305 schools having appeared in the summer tourney at least once. Sixty-three of those schools are no longer open or have merged with other schools but their baseball connection has been preserved. Relatively speaking nearly 86% of the 346 schools playing baseball this summer have a "state tournament connection."

An All-Time Best List can be found on our baseball page of our website -- <u>www.iahsaa.org</u> then click on "Baseball" and scroll down. The website list is updated as new information is received and at the end of the season. For that reason, we no longer include the game, season and career lists as part of this book. We are indebted to those who have validated each of the performances listed. We consider the lists to be a work in progress. Most of the entries are from 1960 to the present. As information from is received and documented it will be added.

The compiling and maintaining of the lists is a daunting task especially since they were constructed from scratch starting in 2002. All-time best performances have not always been vogue or in demand. However, it has been the philosophy of the IHSAA for over 100 years that student-athletes and their programs are important. We view the work accomplished by those students, coaches, schools and communities as a vital component of the rich heritage of high school athletics in lowa.

### SUMMER CHAMPIONSHIP GAME HIGHLIGHTS

- <u>1946</u> Gene Taylor pitched a two-hitter to lead Burlington to a 7-2 win over Stanhope. He struck out 11. Burlington scored three times in the first inning on an error and a two-run single by Mel Berges. Bill Savage had a sensational fielding game for the Grayhounds and had a pair of hits. Wayne Duke (later the Big Ten Conference Commissioner) was captain of the Burlington team.
- <u>1947</u> Bancroft, St. John took a 1-0 lead in the top of the fifth inning but Cedar Rapids, Wilson scored single runs in the fifth and sixth to post a 2-1 win. **A balk brought in the winning run. Frank Simanovsky was the winning pitcher on a two-hit, 10 strikeout performance.** Bill Rustemier took the loss. Wilson had five hits -- two of them by Chuck Petefish.
- 1948 Cedar Rapids, Wilson defeated Kanawha, 5-3, as they scored four runs in the first two innings. Wilson out hit Kanawha, 9-5, with Chuck Fulton leading the way with three base knocks. Lowell Thomsen led Kanawha with a pair of hits. The winning pitcher for the second straight championship was Frank Simanovsky.
- <u>1949</u> Cedar Rapids, Franklin, trailing 4-0 after one inning, rallied for a 9-5 win over Clemons. Winning pitcher Dick Dickson allowed seven hits. The top hitter on the championship club was catcher Bill Quimby (later a NFL official). Vern Schrimper led the pitchers with a 5-1 record including a state semifinal-round win, while Dickson was 5-5, Bob Woodward 3-0, and Bob Cooper 3-2.

- <u>1950</u> Cedar Rapids, Wilson pushed across an unearned run in the ninth inning to post a 2-1 triumph over Whittemore, Presentation Academy. Wilson collected six hits off losing hurler Lee Elbert including two each by Norval Oliver and Robert Snyder. Wally Krouse was the starting pitcher for Wilson, but Bernard Erenberger hurled the final two innings and got credit for the win.
- <u>1951</u> Despite being out-hit by Exira 15-7, Corwith lost a 13-11 decision. Exira rallied for 12 runs over the last three innings to erase a 7-0 deficit. A total of 13 walks and five Corwith errors aided the Exira cause. Don Spoo went the distance for the win. He fanned 10 and survived Corwith's 15-hit assault. Ted Jensen's double, after a pair of walks, plated the winning runs for Exira.
- <u>1952</u> After trailing, 2-1 early, Colesburg posted a 9-5 win over Glidden. A five-run sixth inning clinched the win. The Colesburg star was Rich Sampson who hurled a five-hitter and added two hits, including a homer, and scored four runs. Gary Bush also blasted a three-run triple. Colesburg had a total of nine hits off a pair of Glidden hurlers. Dale Tryon led the Glidden attack with a pair of base hits.
- <u>1953</u> Eight runs in the first two innings proved decisive as Council Bluffs, Thomas Jefferson defeated Dysart, 9-5. The hits were close -- 8-7 in favor of Tee Jay. Pitcher Stu Steiner was the Bluffs star, scattering seven hits and driving in three runs with a triple. Roger Santman took the loss. Emmons hit a home run for Council Bluffs.
- <u>1954</u> Coach Jim Nora's son, Jack, hurled a one-hitter and batted in four of his team's runs with a double and a homer as Dubuque stopped Valley, West Des Moines, 7-1. He struck out 14. The lone hit he allowed was a single to Lew Pignari. Dubuque scored four runs in the first inning and pinned the loss on Larry Anderson who allowed six hits but fanned 11.
- <u>1955</u> Valley, West Des Moines scored a 2-0 shutout win over Calamus behind the two-hit pitching of Frank Anderson. For Anderson, it was the sixth straight shutout during the tourney series and ran his string of scoreless innings to 44. He won all 11 games he pitched during the season. Valley got its runs in the fourth inning. The Tigers collected just four hits off losing hurler Murray Vetter two of them by Elton Wolfe including an RBI double.
- <u>1956</u> In a miraculous finish, the Muscatine Muskies rallied for seven runs in the seventh inning to overcome a 3-0 deficit and post a 7-3 victory over Council Bluffs, Thomas Jefferson. Jefferson starter Bruce Johnson had pitched a three-hit shutout until the seventh. Ed Reifert fired a five-hitter for the win. Bob Frieze had two triples for Jefferson. Muscatine collected eight hits two of them by non-starter Wes Hagens. A two-run single by Ev White gave the Muskies the lead for good.
- <u>1957</u> Defending champion Muscatine posted its 21st straight win of the season and its 36th straight over two seasons as they stopped Bancroft, St. John, 7-2. Each team had four hits and the winning pitcher, Ron Reifert, struck out 12. It was Reifert's 22nd pitching win over a two-year period and his 16th victory of the Muskies season total of 21. As was the case a year earlier, the Muscatine rallied after trailing, 2-0, early. A triple by Jim Freese produced a tie and the lead run came home on an interference call. An insurance run was provided on Bob Steckman's squeeze bunt. Tom Clark and Denny Menke handled the pitching chores for the Johnnies.
- <u>1958</u> A 2-0 victory over Creston gave Muscatine its third straight title. Jim Freese hit a solo homer in the third and Tom Long's squeeze bunt in the fourth tallied the other. Ron Reifert hurled a two-hitter for the pitching win. He fanned 13 and finished his three-year career at 36-1. Over the three seasons, the Muskies had a record of 61-4. Dean Conley was the losing pitcher. He allowed six hits.
- 1959 Jim Larsen, the winner, and losing pitcher, Ed Watt, each hurled a two-hitter as Council Bluffs, Thomas Jefferson bumped lowa City, 2-0. Two walks and a hit batsman loaded the bases TJ in the second with one out after which two runs scored on a fielders' choice and a steal of home. Watt allowed only two balls to be hit out of the infield and established a championship game record by fanning 15. Larsen struck out 11 and did not walk a batter. He retired the last 15 men he faced -- eight on strikes.
- <u>1960</u> Bill Drummond issued just one hit a single by Gary LaCourse as Council Bluffs, Thomas Jefferson stopped Clinton, St. Mary's, 3-0. Losing pitcher Larry Peterson yielded seven hits -- two by Drummond including a double, and a double and a pair of singles by Don Dew.
- <u>1961</u> Ames scored three runs in the sixth inning to overhaul Fredericksburg, 3-1. The Little Cyclones bunched all three of its hits for the runs. The big blow was a two-run single by Mike Karns. Dave Agard went the distance on the mound for the Little Cyclones on a four-hitter. Harold Ross and Jim Gitch were the pitchers for Fredericksburg.
- <u>1962</u> Pitcher Bill Drummond and Tom Zimmerman starred in Council Bluffs, Jefferson 2-0 win over Williamsburg. Zimmerman drove home both runs with a third inning single. Drummond allowed three hits and struck out 15.

- **Losing hurler Lloyd Brockshus gave up four hits and fanned 15.** The two tied the State Championship game record for the most strike outs by a pitcher and set another mark for the most combined strike outs in a championship game. Ron Holden had two of the Williamsburg hits.
- <u>1963</u> Bob Bentley scored the winning run on an error in the last of the 12th inning as Clinton, St. Mary's edged Council Bluffs, Thomas Jefferson, 2-1. St. Mary's had five hits to three for Jefferson. Bentley was the starting pitcher for St. Marys before yielding to Brennan after nine innings and the reliever got the win. It was a banner day for Bentley as he was also the only player with two or more hits and his 15 strike outs tied the State Championship game record.
- <u>1964</u> Clinton scored a 7-2 victory over Council Bluffs, Thomas Jefferson as **Craig McNeil spun a three-hitter.** Jefferson led early, and it was just 3-2 in favor of Clinton until the River Kings scored four times in the top of the seventh. Jack Holder was the losing pitcher. No one had multiple hits.
- <u>1965</u> Jack Mustapha pitched Boone to a 2-0 victory over Burlington. It was the third straight tourney no-hitter for Mustapha who fanned 12. Boone scored its runs in the third inning with Mustapha's double being the key blow. Steve Crandall had Boone's other hit.
- 1966 Cedar Rapids, Washington nipped Council Bluffs, Thomas Jefferson, 5-4, as Tom Madson's double drove home the winning run in the last of the seventh inning. Steve Seyfer launched a two-run homer to help Washington take the lead. Jim Grazier was the losing pitcher while Washington reliever Caldwell got the win after working just one-third of an inning. Close hurled the first six and two-thirds. Thomas had three hits for TJ as they out-hit the winners, 8-7. Case also had two hits for Thomas Jefferson and McClure knocked home two of their runs. Mike Seyfer had a pair of hits for the champions.
- <u>1967</u> A sacrifice fly by Tom Peterson with the bases loaded brought home the deciding run as Boone edged Newman Catholic, Mason City, 4-3, in 10 innings. Coach Bill Sapp's son, Dick, was the winning pitcher. He hurled the first nine innings for Boone and Peterson pitched the tenth. Jim Sallee hurled nine innings for Newman and struck out ten. He also had two of his team's five hits. Kelly McMullan had a two-run triple for Boone as the Toreadors also collected five hits.
- <u>1968</u> Beckman, Dyersville edged Norway, 5-4, when Lloyd Koelker raced home with the decisive run on a fifth-inning Norway error. Bob Butz was the starting pitcher for Norway, but relief man Terry Brecht was tagged with the loss. Koelker was the winning pitcher as he split the duties with starter Kramer. Each team had seven hits. Max Elliot had two for Norway and Jim Overman rapped a pair for Beckman.
- <u>1969</u> Fort Dodge pounded out nine hits including six doubles and a Vic Gordon home run in stopping Cedar Rapids, Kennedy, 8-4. Dave Vaughn socked two doubles and plated three runs for the Dodgers while Gordon also singled to end with a pair of RBI's. Mike Curran had two hits and two RBI's for Kennedy as they also collected nine base hits. Tom Walters went the distance for the winners and fanned 11. Steve Hines and Jack Ostberg shared the pitching for Kennedy with Hines taking the loss.
- <u>1970</u> Randy Finholt's double and a single by Randy Rima drove in the runs as Decorah stopped Cedar Rapids, Jefferson, 2-0. Chuck Lynch was the winning pitcher with last inning relief help from Bill Varner. They allowed three hits two by Mike Curran. Decorah got five hits off losing pitcher Steve Keiper including two by Finholt. The game was scoreless until the sixth inning. The Vikings' pitching staff was impressive during the run to the title, registering seven shutouts in nine tournament games and allowing just two runs.
- <u>1971</u> Benton Community blanked Burlington, 3-0, as Dan Strellner pitched a two-hitter. Benton collected seven hits including a pair in the fifth inning when the Bobcats scored their runs with the aid of an outfield error. **Strellner, Tom Wessling, and Steve Gallagher had two hits each.** One of Wessling's hits was a double. Burlington used three pitchers and the loss was tagged on reliever Bill Fuhrer.
- 1972 Mason City eked out a 3-2 win over Council Bluffs, Abraham Lincoln in 10 innings as three Mohawk hurlers combined for a two-hit, 10-strikeout performance. Mark Adams got the victory. Tony Pappas scored the winning run on an error. Mason City got six hits off losing pitcher Mike Moroney. Pappas and Steve Strathman had two hits each for the winners. It was the final game for retiring, winning coach Elmer Starr ending 44 years of prep coaching, the last 26 at Mason City.
- <u>1973</u> <u>2-A:</u> Council Bluffs, Thomas Jefferson pounded Ames, 16-2, in a five inning affair. TJ erupted for nine runs in the first inning sending 14 batters to the plate. They led, 12-0, in the third when rain suspended the game for one day. Thomas Jefferson roughed up three Ames hurlers for 15 hits. Kelly Summy and Tim Podraza had three hits each and Podraza had four RBI's for TJ. Winning pitcher Bob Knezevich smacked a three-run homer in that big first inning. Ames had six hits two by Mark Berthelsen.

- 1-A: Kee, Lansing snapped Sioux Center's 23-game winning streak, 5-2, as Steve Fink's 15 strike outs tied a championship game record. Three unearned runs helped the Hawks as they were outhit, 6-5. Doug Bulman had two hits for Kee. For Sioux Center, losing pitcher Bruce Lubach and Greg Beernink each had two hits and Kirk Hulstein came through with two RBI's.
- <u>1974</u> <u>2-A:</u> Greg and Jeff Merritt starred as Dubuque, Hempstead posted a 2-1 decision over Burlington. Greg hit the first pitch of the game for an inside-the-park home run and Jeff saved the game defensively in the final inning with spectacular outfield grab of a potential home run ball. The home run by Greg Merritt was the only hit off tough luck loser Russ Larson. A walk, stolen base, wild pitch, and sacrifice fly by Gary Schiltz brought home what proved to be the winning run in the Hempstead fourth. Mark Dean, the winning pitcher, allowed five hits -- two by Steve Conn. Heavy rains over a two-week period forced the game to be moved from Cedar Rapids to Boone and was played on August 14.
- 1-A: Spalding Catholic, Granville scored four first-inning runs and held on for a 4-1 win over LaPorte City. Russ Herrig's two-run triple was the big blow for Spalding. The winners got six hits off two LaPorte pitchers as Dick Kenney collected a pair. Bert Tecklenberg was tagged with the loss. The winning pitcher was Tom Roder who allowed five hits with Tim Marshall notching two.
- 1975 2-A: Burlington overcame an early 2-0 deficit and rallied for a 6-4 victory over Davenport, Central. Dennis Miller, who had won two previous state tourney games including a no-hitter in the semis, was the winning pitcher. Dennis Park was the starter, but Miller came on in relief in the first inning. They allowed six hits including two each by Frank Pena and Don McGregor. McGregor was the starting and losing pitcher. He got relief help from Dave Hoeksema. Bob Gibbs and Mark Ertz collected three hits each for the winners and Ertz drove three runs home.
- 1-A: Junior Graff starred in Spalding Catholic's 1-0 win over Grundy Center. His suicide squeeze bunt in the first provided the only run and he also pitched a three-hitter for the victory. Dan Szegda was the tough luck loser as he allowed only two hits.
- <u>1976</u> <u>2-A:</u> Mike Zier stroked a run scoring single in the bottom of the eighth in Marshalltown's 1-0 victory over Davenport, Central. Roger Beall was the winning pitcher. He allowed eight hits but stranded 11 runners. The loser, Tom Mullen, yielded just four hits and fanned 13. Zier and Roger Mason had two hits each for the Bobcats. For Central, Dave Ames and Dave Hoeksema had two hits each.
- 1-A: After a 5-5 tie, Larry Meyer and Randy Vogt socked home runs to power MFL, Monona past Bancroft, St. John, 8-6. Plagge, the losing pitcher, and Jim Mauss had two hits each for Kee.
- <u>1996</u> <u>4-A:</u> Jim Magrane starred on the mound as Ottumwa stopped Sioux City, East, 3-2. Ottumwa scored the winning run in the bottom of the sixth inning. **Magrane yielded just two hits and whiffed 10.** Ottumwa had seven hits. Dave Drew and Travis Shepard had two hits each for Ottumwa.
- <u>3-A:</u> Harlan Community banged out 10 hits in a 7-3 title conquest over Independence. Justin Cox led the hit parade with a single, triple and an inside-the-park home run. Sam Wageman had two hits and drove in three runs. The winning pitcher was Danny Schiltz who came on in relief in the third inning.
- <u>2-A:</u> St. Albert, Council Bluffs topped Beckman Catholic, Dyersville, 5-2, behind Eric Janecek's five-hitter. The Falcons had eight hits. Beckman put four of their hits together in the first two innings to score twice but Janecek quieted them after that. Josh McGruder had three hits and Mark Hartensen two for the winners.
- 1-A: North Kossuth, Swea City defeated Kee, Lansing, 7-5, and out-hit the Hawks, 10-8. A pair of three-run innings in the middle innings propelled North Kossuth. Keith Vaske was the winning pitcher. It was his 23rd win in two seasons without a loss. Mike Peters had two hits for Lansing. For North Kossuth, Vaske had three hits while Andy Wolf and David Sandbulte both had two.
- <u>1997</u> <u>4-A:</u> The title game was a rematch of the 1996 affair as Ottumwa repeated with an 8-4 win over Sioux City, East. The Bulldogs hammered out 11 hits. Rick Thompson went the distance and drove in a pair of runs. The game was tied, 4-4, until Ottumwa put three runs on the board in the bottom of the fifth inning. Britt Jervik of East had half of his team's six hits. Mike Olujic, Ryan McAllister and Brandon Cravett had two hits each for Ottumwa. Ottumwa finished at 32-12 and became the first 4-A back-to-back champion since Dowling, WDM, 1988-89.
- 3-A: Spencer and Pella combined for only seven hits but the Tigers scored twice in the top of the first inning to stop the Little Dutch, 2-0. Both pitchers went the distance. Chad Susie of Spencer allowed four hits and Pella's Todd Vande Noord only yielded three. B.J. Koch and John Scott drove in the Spencer runs. Pella had averaged seven runs

per game in their previous starts but Cole Van Vark was the only Little Dutch player to reach third base. He socked a first inning triple.

- 2-A: In a slugfest, Mount Vernon ripped a championship record 17 hits to down Sioux Central, Sioux Rapids, 14-7, in eight innings. The two teams combined for a title game mark of 28 hits. A total of seven pitchers two by Mount Vernon were used. A seven-run Mount Vernon attack in the top of the eighth snapped a 7-7 deadlock. Kasey Krager of Sioux Central forced the extra inning when he doubled in the two runs with two outs in the bottom of the seventh. A five-inning relief stint which featured eight strike-outs gave Doug Hess the pitching win ... his 15th of the season with no losses. Jake Schoening had three hits and Jeremy Johnson two for Sioux Central. John Aronowitz had for base hits for Mount Vernon. Three other players had three hits each. Adam McDermott of Mount Vernon was credited with four RBIs.
- 1-A: Keith Vaske finished a brilliant high school career by pitching his North Kossuth, Swea City team (31-7) to its second consecutive championship. The victim this time was Notre Dame, Burlington, 7-3. Vaske had pitched North Kossuth to a 7-5 win over Kee in the 1996 finale and finished his prep career with a perfect 35-0 mound record. Vaske allowed five hits while his teammates had eight. Jared Rahe and Tony Garry knocked in a pair of runs each for the winners. Andy Jansen had two hits. For Notre Dame, Jon Kerr had two hits and two RBIs.
- <u>1998</u> <u>4-A:</u> The Cromer twins, Nathan and Jason, starred as Des Moines, Lincoln posted a 3-2 win over Bettendorf. Jason provided a two-run single and Nathan earned a pitching save. The teams had five hits each and Chris Phillips of Bettendorf was the only man in either line-up with two hits. Trailing 1-0, Lincoln scored all three of its runs in the bottom of the fifth inning.
- 3-A: Bill Zenk hurled a one-hitter and Vinton-Shellsburg collected 10 hits as Perry fell, 10-0, in six innings. Zach Mann hit a two-run homer for the winners while three teammates collected two hits each.
- <u>2-A:</u> North Polk got 14 strike outs from pitcher John A. Warner but lowa Falls blanked the Comets, 2-0. The Cadets scored both runs in the top of the third inning and stayed sound behind winning pitcher Prentice Lofstedt who struck out eight.
- <u>1-A:</u> Newman Catholic, Mason City slammed Cedar Rapids, LaSalle with 10 runs in the first inning of a 13-1, six inning triumph. Adam Crooks had four of his five RBI in that initial frame. One of his game high three hits was a home run. Brian Powers was the winning pitcher. He allowed eight hits while Newman collected 15.
- <u>1999</u> <u>4-A:</u> Dowling Catholic, West Des Moines out-hit Ankeny, 7-5, and outscored the Hawks, 6-1. A total of eight pitchers, four for each team, saw duty. Brian Kline had three RBIs for the winning Maroons while Scott Sibbel homered for the Hawks' only run. Ankeny's Travis Salter was the only batter in either lineup with two hits.
- 3-A: Greg Thissen drove in four runs to propel Assumption, Davenport, to a 9-2 win over Spencer and their fifth title. Pitcher David Dexter scattered seven hits while Assumption collected a dozen. Six Assumption runs in the first two innings doomed the Tigers. Zac Boulund homered for the winners and Ben Schroeder had three hits. Aaron Slota and Josh Edmonds had two hits each for Spencer.
- <u>2-A:</u> Hard-hitting Bishop Garrigan, Algona was stymied by pitcher Tony Leick of St. Albert, Council Bluffs as the Falcons registered a 2-0 win. Leick allowed just two hits. St. Albert collected five hits and Chris Lownes of the Falcons had two of them. Losing pitcher Brad Nelson had one of his team's two hits and fanned 11.
- 1-A: Gehlen Catholic, LeMars opened with five runs in the first two innings and went on to a 6-2 decision over Southeast Warren, Liberty Center. Gehlen also won the hit battle, 7-5. Justin Kellen homered and had another hit for Gehlen while Curt Gengler also had a pair of hits. Losing pitcher Waylon Byers had three of his team's hits.
- <u>2000</u> <u>4-A:</u> Urbandale captured its first state title with a 5-4 victory over Marshalltown. The J-Hawks scored in their last at-bat when Marc Ripperger made it home from second following a single to left by Blake Schultz in the bottom of the eighth inning. The one-out single gave Urbandale a 32-13 overall record.
- 3-A: Fort Madison held-off Denison-Schleswig in the late innings to capture its first state title with a 3-2 decision. Leading the way for Fort Madison was pitcher Andy Fuget, who allowed just two hits over six and two-thirds innings and recorded five strikeouts. Relieving Fuget was Jeff Lamb, who made just his third appearance of the season. He notched a key two out strikeout with the bases loaded in the seventh inning.

- <u>2-A:</u> Beckman Catholic, Dyersville captured its third state crown with a 4-0 victory over West Branch. Tony Kruse had three of Beckman's eight hits and sophomore Matt Ungs hurled a three-hit shutout. Beckman finished with a 31-9 overall record but was 18-0 record against Class 2-A teams.
- <u>1-A:</u> Spalding Catholic, Granville continued its impressive offensive output in the title game as the Spartans outscored Kee, Lansing, 7-2. **Spalding outscored its three state tournament opponents, 44-4.** With Kee leading, 2-1, Spalding tacked up four runs in the fifth inning.
- 2001 <u>4-A:</u> Dowling Catholic, West Des Moines slugged its way to a fourth title in 12 trips by routing Marshalltown 13-2. Matt Macri, Drew Davidson, Zach Dillon, Aaron Fangman and Tim Heaston led the power surge with home runs. The five blasts set a title game record. The Maroons also knocked a total of eight round trippers in the tourney, and ended the summer with a 42-3 mark.
- <u>3-A</u> Bishop Heelan Catholic, Sioux City notched its first ever diamond title defeating West Delaware, Manchester, 5-1. Catcher Ben Stedman's two-run triple in the third and Mike Winklepleck's solo home run in the seventh were the big blows for the Crusaders. Brett Stedman got the mound victory, allowing just four hits.
- <u>2-A:</u> Emmetsburg scored seven runs in its final two at-bats to rally for a dramatic 7-6 over Cinderella-like Eagle Grove. Mike Wentzel blasted a three-run bomb in the sixth and drove in the final three runs with a two-out, two-strike double. His six rbis was one shy of tying the tournament record set by Dowling's Ron Foster in 1988. This was the E-Hawks second trip to the tourney and they finished with a 30-2 record. Eagle Grove was in the tournament for the first time.
- <u>1-A:</u> Spalding Catholic, Granville and Kee, Lansing hooked up in the title contest for the second straight year and the script did not change. The Spartans shut out the Hawks, 5-0, behind Alex Budden's one-hit, nine strikeout gem. The game marked the first time in 14 championship contests that Kee failed to score. Dean Meis' second inning RBI single staked Budden to all he needed as Spalding added four unearned runs in the sixth to win its fifth state crown.
- 2002 4-A: Marshalltown rallied for a 9-6 triumph over Cedar Rapids, Kennedy to win its fifth crown. The "gold" came after back-to-back second place finishes the previous two years. Mitch Walser's three-run blast in the third put Kennedy up 6-2. But the Bobcats rallied with a four run fifth highlighted by Tim Flannagan's two-run circuit clout and a two-run single by Ryan Swartz. Jeff Clement who set a new national record with 75 career home runs got the mound victory striking out 10. A record 3,512 fans witnessed the 4-A and 2-A title games.
- 3-A: Knoxville was dominating in winning its first championship as they outscored three opponents 30-7. A 10-3 title victory over tourney veteran Assumption, Davenport punctuated the dominance. After allowing two runs in the top of the first, the Panthers responded with five of their own, then rode the solid pitching of Adam Miller, who fanned 11. Miller also cracked a pair of doubles. He got good support from Brian Joynt, who added a triple and a single, and Craig Cameron who doubled and singled.
- <u>2-A:</u> Brett Jensen's three-hit, 3-0 blanking of top-seeded Beckman Catholic, Dyersville erased Eagle Grove's memory of the 2001 championship loss to Emmetsburg. Jensen's performance included nine strike outs and no walks. He also doubled in the Eagles' first run. It was only the second time in 43 games that the Blazers had failed to score. Matt Peterson's two-run double in the third provided some insurance.
- 1-A: Newman Catholic, Mason City won its second state title in convincing fashion with an 18-5, five-inning whipping of North Tama, Traer. The Knights exploded for 14 runs in the fourth to break-a-way from a 4-2 lead. They sent 17 players to the plate in the fourth with 15 consecutively reaching base safely. Nick Moisman slammed a two-run homer and an RBI double in the fourth. Tanner Hoel drove across five runs with three hits in the game. Newman's 18 runs were the most in a championship game in the 57 years of the tournament, and equals the 18 that Norway scored against Decorah in the 1968 spring title game.
- 2003 4-A: Valley, WDM snagged its third summer baseball title and second under coach Steve Mohr by polishing off Dubuque Hempstead 13-3. The Tigers unleashed a 14-hit assault which included three home runs and six doubles. Four players had multiple hits with Matt Staskal clubbing three. Ryan Tousely hurled a four-hitter, striking out seven. Hempstead's Brain Wagner joined the record pages as he laced two home runs for the Mustangs, becoming the fifth player in championship action to launch a pair of circuit shots.
- 3-A: Harlan Community won its second title and its final 17 games of the season to reign as the 3A champions. The Cyclones title path included a one-run triumph over defending champion Knoxville (7-6) in the semifinals and another nail-biter, 4-3 over Waukee in the championship. Waukee struck for two first inning runs but Harlan put up a three spot in the bottom of the inning and added an insurance run when Alex Schomers' smacked a two-out double in the

fifth. Heath Stein notched the mound victory with five innings of relief work, while brother Eric ended the tourney with six straight hits over a two-day period.

- <u>2-A:</u> Carlisle used the long ball in its 6-2 win over Beckman Catholic, Dyersville who finished runner-up for the second straight year. T.J. Cataldo rifled a solo "tatter" in the fourth and smoked a two-run shot in the sixth which put the Wildcats up for good, 3-2. He is one of five preps in lowa annals to crank out two home runs in a summer title game. Drew Laidig got his second pitching win of the tourney, fanning seven and walking just one. The Wildcats ended the year with 56 circuit clouts, sixth best on the state's all-time charts.
- 1-A: Van Meter's historic baseball roots sank deeper into tournament lore, as the Bulldogs won its first summer title edging Spalding Catholic, Granville, 4-3. The school also owns the 1946 Fall Championship. The Spartans appeared headed for their sixth summer title when John Bunkers' two-run, two-out double put them up 3-2 in the top of the seventh. But Kyle Edwards was the Van Meter hero with a one-out two-run single in the home half of the final frame for the win. It was a measure of redemption as Edwards gave up Bunkers' hit moments earlier after relieving Scott Blue who had allowed just four hits in the first six and two-thirds innings.
- 2004 <u>4-A:</u> Valley edged Des Moines Lincoln, 1-0, scoring on a throwing error in the fourth inning and riding Ben Percival's four hitter and errorless defense to their second straight title. The Tigers cut down the potential tying run at the plate to end the game. It took a perfect throw from left fielder Andy Ewald to end Coach Steve Mohr's career on a winning note. Mohr finished a 25-year campaign at 631-259.
- 3-A: Assumption, Davenport racked up its sixth summer title by disposing of Charles City, 8-1. The Knights unleashed a 14-hit assault with Joe Conklin cranking out three. Ben Irmen, Brunson Grothus, John Powers and winning hurler Dan O'Donnell each contributed two hits.
- <u>2-A</u>: A five-run fifth by Mid-Prairie, Wellman helped the Golden Hawks to their first state title in any sport with a 7-3 triumph over upstart South O'Brien, Paullina. Chris Driscol drilled three hits for the champions, and each Mid-Prairie starter collected at least one. South O'Brien was bidding to be the first number eight seed to win a title since Ankeny in 1999.
- 1-A: Martensdale-St. Marys sent Coach Jim Donohue into retirement with a championship by white-washing tournament rich Newman Catholic, Mason City 6-0. Cousins Matt Davitt and Sean Smith keyed the title run. Davitt worked six scoreless innings, fanning 11 and allowing just three hits as he won for the 29th consecutive time. Smith rapped out three hits in the title game and when the senior catcher wasn't behind the plate he was on the hill or leading the offense with his hitting and base running. Donohue's 33-year career record ended at 752-299.
- 2005 4-A: Valley became the first large school to win three straight state titles since Muscatine in 1956-58 as they edged a determined Ankeny bunch, 8-6. The Tigers, with a 2006 title, can join Kee, Lansing; Norway; and St. Mary's, Remsen as the only schools to notch four straight big trophies. The Tigers battled back from a 5-2 deficit after A.J. Shindler's two-run second inning homer gave them a 2-0 lead. A four-run sixth lifted Valley as they scored on a passed ball, an error, Brett Ferguson's single, and a double by Josh Dow. Ferguson, who got the mound win in relief, and Jordan Burrows each had two hits for the champions. First year head coach Ryan Cooley led the Tigers.
- 3-A: After Xavier, Cedar Rapids rallied for two runs and a 3-3 tie in the top of the seventh but Bishop Heelan came up with the game winner in their half of the inning for the school's second state baseball title. Designated hitter Joe Wendte and winning pitcher Stephen Keane (11-0) came up heroes with two hits each and two rbis. Wendte delivered a one-out, walk off seventh inning single to end the game. Keane scattered six hits and struck out seven to pick up the win for Coach Chris Bork.
- <u>2-A:</u> Wilton (42-0) became the first unbeaten team since Kee in 1973 to claim a state championship with an 8-3 conquest of Kuemper Catholic, Carroll. The Beavers needed a six-run sixth after the Knights took a 1-0 lead after five. Wes Freie, Jeremy Weih and Matt Wagaman each had a pair of hits and two rbis. Evan Cooling and reliever Freie held the Knights to three hits. Winning coach Jake Souhrada joins his father Tom (Davenport West) as the second father-son combo to win titles.
- 1-A: Kee, Lansing made wise use of six hits, nine walks, a hit batsman and three Spalding Catholic errors to dispose of the Spartans, 10-0 in five innings. It marked the ninth time that Kee has ruled their class. Each of the titles has been under national win leader Coach Gene Schultz (1,447-312-1). Clayton Welsh doubled and singled twice to account for half of the winner's hits as he drove in a pair of runs. Matt Halverson had a pair of run scoring hits, while Andy Beck cleared the bases with a double and added another rbi on a sacrifice. Jordan Duffy spun a three-hitter to win three games in the same tournament.

- 2006 4-A: Valley, WDM won its fourth straight championship by rolling past three opponents by the 10-run rule. In doing so, the Tigers became the first 4A school to ever win four straight titles. In the final tilt the Tigers needed just five innings to blank Cedar Rapids Kennedy 13-0. Eleven different Valley players had hits in the title game with Jake Williams, Tim Cooper and Ricardo Flores each socking a pair. Mike Bilicki, Tyler Raymond and Josh Dow each drove in a pair of runs. Dow silenced the Cougars on one hit to notch his second mound victory of the tournament. The title was Valley's fifth overall.
- 3-A: Xavier, Cedar Rapids overwhelmed the 3A field by outscoring opponents 33-9 and notching at least one run in each of their last 15 tournament innings. The Saints had a 10-2 championship win over Epworth Western Dubuque. The title win was keyed by a five run third which broke up a 2-2 contest. It was a nightmarish inning for the Bobcats who committed two errors and four wild pitches to go with a two-run single by Thomas Hotz and an rbi-single by Chad Arp, who also tripled to join Dave Drahozal with two hits.
- <u>2-A</u>: Assumption, Davenport jumped to a 4-0 lead in the first then held off North Polk for the 2A title -- the school's seventh overall and first in Class 2A. The win was the Knight's 16th in their last 17 games and halted a 30-game victory streak by North Polk. Kyle Steinbrecher, Mackey Pangburn and Tyler Mallonee each had two hits for the winners with Michael Schwartz and Chris Kolar each driving in a pair of runs. Jake West picked up the pitching victory. He had no-hit Boyden-Hull/Rock Valley in the opening game of the tourney.
- 1-A: After 61 years of summer baseball, Lenox notched its first state championship with a 10-5 triumph over Sentral, Fenton in eight innings. The Tigers parlayed two Sentral errors, a walk and three base hits in the eighth to plate five runs for the win. Cruz Reed and Trey Christensen delivered key RBI singles. Alex Peterson laced three hits while Kaleb Evans and Grant Clavin each had two for the winners. Jake Samo, who hurled Lenox's first two tourney wins gave way to eighth-grader Jordan Hohensee who got the win. It is believed that he is the first eighth grader in the history of the tournament to be the winning pitcher in a championship game. Sentral's Shaun McGuire ripped a championship record two triples and had another hit.
- 2007 4-A: Urbandale notched its second state championship, both under Coach Dennis Barton, as they overcame an early Davenport Central lead to win 4-2. The J-Hawks surrendered a solo home run off the bat of Drew Taylor in the second, but tied the game in the third on Sean Raisch's single. In the fourth UHS (37-8) parlayed a walk, a sacrifice bunt, the first of Austin Duede's two singles and throwing error and a dropped fly ball to take a 4-1 lead. Brad Watson got the mound win in relief.
- 3-A: West Delaware proved to be the best in Class 3-A, defeating defending champion Xavier, Cedar Rapids, 8-0, in the championship. The Hawks (39-3) got a nifty two-hit shut-out from BJ Hersem, who fanned six and did not issue a walk. Meanwhile six different players for Coach Mike Morrison drove in runs with Garrett Linderwell plating a pair. Phil Keppler and Dan Marshall helped set the table each with a pair of hits. Justin Gideon went yard for the Hawks their 74th of the season and second best all-time.
- <u>2-A:</u> Rated and seeded first Cherokee won all three tournament games by one or two runs including a thrilling 5-4 decision over defending champion Assumption, Davenport in the finals. It was the first ever state championship for the 31-2 Braves. After Assumption tied the game at 4-all in the top of the fourth, Cherokee answered when Cody Ege walked, took second on a wild pickoff throw and scored when Tyler Jones delivered a single. Jones and Kyle Ruehle each had two hits for the winners as did losing hurler Jared McIntosh. Matt Koch notched his second tournament mound win in relief of Ruehle.
- 1-A: lowa Mennonite School, Kalona playing in its first ever State Baseball Tournament outscored three opponents 20-1 to win "the gold." IMS (28-3) uncorked a 13-hit assault in the championship to record a 10-0 five inning win over Saint Mary's, Remsen. Heroes were a plentiful. Reggie Hochstedler silenced the heavy-hitting Hawks on just two hits while striking out 10 and running his two-game total to 24 in 12 innings. On the offensive side eight IMS players drove in runs with Bradley Hershberger plating two. Darrell Bontrager had three hits and scored three times Hershberger, Clint Gingerich, Levi Ney, and Branson Ropp each added two hits.
- 2008 4-A: Johnston won its second state title and completed their first undefeated season (40-0) by downing fellow CIML rival Marshalltown, 6-2. The Dragons of Coach Randy Wee became the eighth unbeaten champion in the 62-year history of the summer tournament. Other unbeaten large school champions won single class tournaments. Johnston's previous title was in 1A of the 1977 two class tournament. The Dragons out-hit the Bobcats 9-3 with Ryan McCauley's three hits leading the way. Jonathan Nelson rapped a pair of hits to drive in two runs for the winners while Ryan Torgenson and Troy Dubay also had two base knocks and a RBI. Reid Jewell worked the first four innings of one-hit, shutout ball to notch the mound victory.

- 3-A: Centerville rode Jay Schmidt's one-hit, eight strikeout performance to its second title (20 years after the first) as the Big Reds defeated Harlan Community, 1-0. Centerville scored in the first when Patrick Harshman reached on an error and scored later from second on Wallace Carter's single. That was all Schmidt needed as he did not allow a hit until Brett Stein singled with one out in the bottom of the seventh. Harshman and Schmidt each collected two hits to lead Centerville.
- <u>2-A:</u> Assumption, Davenport notched its eighth state title and second in Class 2A by avenging the 2007 final with a 4-2 triumph over Cherokee, Washington. The Knights scored twice in the second to take a 2-1 lead and never looked back. Jake McAllister doubled and singled and Mike Furlong smacked a pair of singles to lead Assumption's offense. Jake Kent fanned six and scattered 10 hits to secure the win. Tyler Jones and Scott Brown each had three hits for the Braves.
- 1-A: North Sentral Kossuth got a stellar performance from its defense and pitcher Shaun McGuire to halt Don Bosco, Gilbertville, 6-2 in the title matchup. McGuire escaped trouble in three critical innings as he allowed six hits and gave up four walks, but fanned eight. His double made him one of five Eagles to hit safely. The winners capitalized on three errors in their scoring summary. Clay Welter and Klayton Breitbach, each with two hits for the Dons.
- 2009 4-A: Top-rated and top seeded Sioux City North (36-7) became the first non-CIML state champion since 1994 as they rode the arm of Dean McArdle to a 4-0 triumph over lowa City West. McArdle who had a hand in all three of the Stars tourney wins had a no-hit gem for six and two-thirds innings. In the seventh he allowed a double by Ryan Rump then fanned the next hitter his 12th of the game to seal the win. Chad Piersma had an rbi single and Nick Tillo ripped a two-run double to give the winners a 3-0 lead in the third. lowa City West, like the Stars, was making its ever appearance in a championship game.
- 3-A: Norwalk's pitching fueled their drive to a second state championship as they blanked upstart Storm Lake, 7-0. Matt Dermody and Kole Klocko allowed just three runs in the tournament. Dermondy struck out 13 in the tourney opener against Decorah, had a relief stint of Klocko who spaced five hits against an outstanding Boone club, then allowed just four hits and struck out 13 in the championship. In the title game, the Warriors (28-13) gave Dermody a 7-0 lead in the first with six players Erik Smith, Marcus Littleton, Travis Meeter, Chase Breeser, Klocko and Michael McGonegle driving in runs. Storm Lake was making its first ever championship appearance and had a storied season, making the tournament for just the second time.
- <u>2-A:</u> St. Edmond, Fort Dodge won its first ever state diamond title, using a solid pitching and an explosive offense. The Gaels (35-3), who held off St. Albert 9-8 in the first game of the tournament, needed nine innings to discard Solon, 8-4 in the semis, before outscoring perennial power Beckman Catholic, Dyersville, 11-8 in the championship. St. Edmond pounded out a tournament high 42 hits and scored 30 runs, including a massive 8-run second in the championship. Joey Flattery and Jon Engler led the hit parade and logged important innings on the mound. Flattery ripped four hits in five trips, knocking home two runs, while hurling five and two-thirds innings. Engler had a pair of doubles for three rbis and pitched the last four outs of the game. Eric DeSousa and Travis Rahe combined for six rbis for the Blazers (32-11).
- <u>1-A:</u> Newman Catholic, Mason City (37-1) dominated the 1A field, outscoring its three opponents 27-2. The Knights lone season loss was by a mere run to cross town 4A rival Mason City. That set off a 15-game win streak climaxed by an 11-1 triumph over upstart and shorthanded Lenox (23-4). Hunter King got his second pitching victory of the tournament in the finals -- a nifty two-hitter with six strike outs. King yielded a run in the first, but the Knights answered with one of their own before tacking on five runs in the second and three each in the third and fifth frames. King, Jonathan Lewerke and Kyle e McCann each had two hits for the winners who got two rbis from Jordan Adams and Joe Nettleton. Lenox played most of the season with the services of just nine or ten players yet earned their fourth straight trip to the tournament with solid team play and superb pitching from sophomore Ethan Westphal.
- 2010 <u>4A</u>: Cedar Rapids Kennedy became the first Mississippi Valley Conference team to claim the "big school" title since Cedar Rapids Washington won it in 1994. The Cougars dropped lowa City West 11-1 in 5-innings to put the finishing touches on a dominating state tournament. In beating three rated teams they hit .411, rapped out 37 hits and scored 33 runs. In the title game the Cougars unleashed a 14-hit assault paced by David Yancey who drove in a pair of runs with a double and two singles. B. J. Cunningham drove across four with a double and a single. Seven different players had RBIs for the winners. Austin Christensen got the mound win allowing only three hits while fanning seven.

- <u>3A:</u> Glenwood appeared in the tournament for the first time and became the 30th team to take home the gold trophy in their debut. The Rams, rated eighth, were the only rated team to make the 3A field. They knocked out 29 hits in three games and rode the strong arms of Taylor Kaufman and Matt Schulz and an error-free defense to the title. Kaufman, who pitched two wins in the tournament, stifled Charles City in a 4-1 championship. He surrendered five hits and struck out 10. He also aided his own cause with a double, a single and an RBI. Third baseman Nick Wells had two to pace the Rams' offense. The Rams finished 30-7 for the season.
- <u>2A:</u> After losing the previous two years in the semifinals, Solon broke through with a signature year as they methodically worked through the Class 2A field for their first baseball title ever. The Spartans nipped a gritty Kuemper Catholic, Carroll team in the finals, 5-2. It was also a record setting year for the champs as they pounded out an lowa record of 130 doubles, which ranks second nationally. Marshall Koehn, who hit .667 for the three-game state series, extended his single season doubles state record and third nationally to 30. Brandon Shulista pitched two of the three wins including the championship. He escaped major damage in four of the seven innings, including making a defensive gem in the seventh to end the game. Nick Day had a pair of hits to lead the Solon offense.
- <u>1A:</u> Martensdale-St. Marys won its second baseball title fashioning a 43-0 record in the process. The Blue Devils made a three-run first stand up in the championship game against. St. Mary's, Remsen. The perfect Blue Devils outscored three state foes, 29-2, and kept hurler Ethan Westphal, who pitched all three triumphs, in control. The champions got a **two-run double from Zeb Noel** in the first and **he and Jake Defenbaugh each collected two hits** in the game. Westphal chalked up 11 strike outs enroute to his 16th season win. In three tournament games, the Blue Devils pounded out nine doubles and four triples among their 26 base knocks. The 43 triumphs they take into 2011 is third on the lowa all-time consecutive win streak.
- 2011 <u>4A</u>: Dowling Catholic (36-7) smoked Mason City pitching for 14 hits in winning their fifth title in 15 trips with a 6-1 triumph. The Maroons darted to a 2-0 lead in the first, taking advantage of Jake Yacinich's sacrifice fly and Connor Bravard's RBI single. In the fourth they added four runs with Jason McMurray smacking a two-run double and Yacinich's another run-scoring single. Braverd led the offense with three hits, while McMurray, Yacinich, Zach Coppola, Dalton Parrott, and Tommy Miller each stroked a pair of hits in the 6-1 win. Dowling pitching twice work out of trouble as Brad Chelleen fanned nine in a three and two-thirds inning relief stint. Coach Tim O'Neill won his second title after guiding Bishop Heelan, Sioux City to the 2001 Class 3A title.
- <u>3A:</u> Solon (39-4) became the first team since Kee, Lansing (1980 and 81) to win state crowns in back-to-back seasons while also moving up in class. The Spartans defeated upstart Harlan Community, 6-1 behind Brandon Shulista, who hurled two of Solon's victories after also pitching the 2010 championship. He fanned nine and allowed four hits while driving in a pair of runs with two singles. After Harlan Community took a 1-0 lead in the first, Solon countered with a four-run third and tacked on insurance runs in the fourth and seventh. Marshall Koehn's two run triple in the third did most of the damage and the senior got his third RBI and second hit in the seventh. Shulista fanned nine and allowed four hits for Coach Keith McSweeney's champs.
- <u>2A:</u> Davis County, Bloomfield made its second straight appearance in the tournament and left with the gold trophy, a 33-4 record and a 23-game winning streak. The Mustangs blanked a gritty Gilbert team, 2-0 in the championship. Nic Johnson and Clint Foster each had a pair of hits for the champions. Johnson and Jacob Davidson singled in runs in the first inning. Josh Martsching notched the pitching win but had strong relief help from mound ace Calvin Mathews, who pitched out of trouble in the fifth and seventh for winning coach Todd White.
- <u>1A:</u> Martensdale-St. Marys (44-0) became the first summer team to post back-to-back undefeated title seasons, in setting a national record of 87-straight wins. The Blue Devils had to rally for one-run wins in their first two tournament games, and against tradition rich Kee, Lansing in the finals. Kee posted a 3-2 lead in the second but **Brad Nauman's double** knotted the game in the third before Coach Justin Dehmer's club struck for four in the fifth and another run in the seventh. **Robert Walker doubled in two runs** in the fifth and **Nauman added a two-run single**. **Ethan Westphal** did not allow a run in a four-inning relief appearance to earn his third mound victory in the tourney. He fanned four and closed out his 45-1 career with 28-straight mound triumphs.
- 2012 4A: Ankeny won its second baseball title and first since 1992 as they posted a 43-2 season record. Coach Mark Hey's team won their final 28 contests. The Hawks removed any doubt as they defeated Davenport, North 14-4 in six innings, stopped CIML rival Valley, WDM, 8-4 and then crushed Fort Dodge, 10-0 in a sixinning title contest. The team cracked a state championship game record 19-hits. Tanner Buenting and Garrett

Fort each smacked four hits to tie a championship game record. Keaton McKinney slammed two doubles and batted in three runs. Matt Johnson picked up the pitching victory, allowing only two hits.

- 3A: After ousting Washington 3-2 in nine innings in their tournament opener, Dallas Center Grimes went on a run scoring spree to claim its first ever state baseball championship. The Mustangs used five innings to beat Epworth, Western Dubuque 12-2 in the semifinals before blanking Decorah 13-0 in the championship. DC-G ripped 28 hits in their final two games to finish the season 38-2. In the title game Jared Kramer drove home three runs with a double and a pair of singles. Tyler Peyton, Dynas Doud, Michael Foggia and Jake Lewis each added a pair of hits. Peyton's hits (a triple and a single) drove across two runs and supported his 13-strikeout effort on the hill. He allowed only four hits.
- <u>2A:</u> Beckman Catholic, Dyersville won its way to a 10th championship game and emerged with its fourth gold trophy and first since 2000. The Blazers (38-7) defeated North Polk, 3-1 in the championship as Adam Noethe and Nate Steger teamed up on the hill. Noethe effectively worked out of three scoring threats and notched the win -- his ninth against no defeats. Steger registered his sixth save of the season. Robbie Anstoetter's four base hits tied a championship game record with his two-run triple providing the margin of victory. North Polk junior Jacob Hadaway lost for the first time in 11 decisions. The title was the third for Blazers' under Coach Tom Jenk, Jr.
- <u>1A:</u> JD Nielsen fired a 1-0 no-hit gem at Newman Catholic, Mason City as Martensdale-St. Marys (40-5) won its third consecutive championship. It was also the third straight 40-win season for the Blue Devils who had a nation's second best winning streak of 88 snapped in the second game of the season. The champions scored in the first when Trent Dooley walked, stole second, to0ok third on a wild pitch and scored on Zeb Noel's ground out to second. Nielsen, who fanned eight was perfect through four and a third innings and stopped threats in the fifth and seventh innings. His pitching gem was the fourth no-hitter in championship game history. Phillip Lapointe allowed only two hits by the winners.
- **2013** <u>4A:</u> Johnston bolted to an 8-0 in winning its third title, a 9-3 triumph over Sioux City, East. The Dragons pounded out 11 hits with seniors **Michael Kinning and Trevor McCauley** collecting three and two hits respectively. They each scored a run and drove across another. **Connor Jacobsen** added a two-run single. **Joe Hawks got the mound win -** his second of the tourney. He went five innings, allowed a run and fanned five. **Hayden Godfrey** led the Black Raiders with a pair of hits and an RBI.
- <u>3A:</u> Clear Lake won its first ever title in only its third trip to the tournament. The team staged a four run seventh inning to win its first game of the tourney over Chariton then overcame a 2-0 deficit after three innings in the title game to best Assumption, Davenport, 6-2. The Knights out-hit the champions, 14-5, but brilliant defense keyed by three double plays kept winning hurler Jerry Kockler steady. Kockler fanned six and walked one while stranding 10 Knights on the bases. Brock Adams led the offense with a pair of hits while Pete Swenson plated two runs. Elliott Duax had three hits for Assumption.
- <u>2A:</u> Top-ranked and defending champion **Beckman Catholic**, **Dyersville** scored on back-to-back bases-loaded walks in the seventh inning to stop North Polk, 2-1. The Comets chances were diminished in the fourth when ace pitcher Jacob Hadaway suffered a broken ankle while running the bases. The Blazers' Joey Lehman held the Comets to just one-hit after they staked a 1-0 lead in the first on one-out double by Reed Smith, a single by Russell Greene and an RBI groundout by Brandon Cory. **Lehman won his 16th game of the season fanning eight and walking four.** It was his 23rd straight victory. This was Beckman Catholic's fourth title in 11 championship games featured in their 15 State appearances.
- <u>1A:</u> Newman Catholic, Mason City claimed its fourth State Championship with a 6-2 win over first time qualifier, Van Buren, Keosauqua. The Knights opened a 5-1 lead with a four-run third inning. Pete LaPointe had the hot bat for the Knights as he drove in four runs with a pair of singles and a sacrifice fly. Joe Burgmeier also had two hits and Kane Louscher had a pair of RBIs for the champs. Van Buren out-hit Newman, 11-9 with Noah Whitten, Robert Barker and Garrett Saunders each notching a pair. Kaden Wadle notched the pitching win for an 8-0 season.
- 2014 <u>4A:</u> Southeast Polk pushed across two first inning runs then rode a storing defense and the four-hit pitching of T.J. Fedders to defeated lowa City, West, 2-0. It was the first ever state diamond championship for the Rams in three state trips and their first ever championship game. Anthony Schneider opened the Rams' first with a double and scored on Nick Arnold's single. Arnold scored later when Zach Hamilton singled. Southeast Polk

out-hit the Trojans 9-4. Fedders recorded six strike outs and walked just one as his defense stranded seven runners – four in scoring position.

- <u>3A:</u> Assumption, Davenport got a **one out run scoring single from Zach Adrian to score Sam Bennett** in a 1-0 walk off triumph over Dallas Center-Grimes. This marked the ninth title for the Knights equaling Kee, Lansing's state record. **Jay Campbell notched the mound victory, scattering five hits and fanning four**. He induced several inning ending outs as the Mustangs left nine runners aboard. Cole Baker was the losing pitcher and did a solid job, striking out seven, and stranding three runners at third before the Knights broke through in the seventh.
- <u>2A:</u> North Polk cast aside the runner-up role they had gained four times including the previous two seasons with a 2-0 win over perennially talent Beckman Catholic, Dyersville. The Comets scored in the first when **Grant Schiltz singled**, stole second and scored on Reed Smith's single. Schiltz's third inning single brought home pinch runner Braedon Ingersoll, who ran for Chris Flynn after he doubled. Winning pitcher Cole Jackson stymied the Blazers on a four-hit, 10 strikeout effort, after fanning 15 in a no-hit victory in the quarterfinals over Maple Valley-Anthon-Oto. Beckman did get seven runners on base with five in scoring position but could not solve Jackson's offerings. It was the 12th championship game for the Blazers who have won five.
- <u>1A:</u> Twin Cedars became the 11th unbeaten champion in 69-year history of the Summer State Tournament as they defeated eight-time finalist and defending champion Newman Catholic, Mason City, 8-2. The champions made wise use of walks, miscues and timely hitting including RBIs from Garrett Pettyjohn's fielder's choice and Drew Carlson's triple. Otis Roby registered nine whiffs and walked two to take the pitching victory. The Sabers finished at 36-0 and with wins in 44 of their last 45 games over a two-year period.
- 2015 <u>4A:</u> Southeast Polk notched its second straight title with a 6-2 win over lowa City, West, who settled for runner up for the fourth time in their nine State Tournament trips. The Rams of Coach Scott Belger didn't waste any time posting four runs the top of the first inning. It all started when Austin Martin hit an RBI single. Cole Hassman knocked a standup two-RBI double and Jake Nelson lined an RBI single for an early 4-0 lead. West came right back in the bottom of the first on a run scoring single by Connor McCaffery but the Trojans could never catch up. Martin and Sam Henry each had three hits in a 12-hit attack for the Rams, while McCaffery had two of the Trojans six hits off winner Thomas McLaughlin who fanned five. The Rams finished 33-13, while the Trojans of Coach Charlie Stumpff wound up 34-12.
- <u>3A:</u> Waverly-Shell Rock first trip to the championship was a memorable one as they exploded for eight runs in the bottom of the fifth to dash Harlan's hope, 11-1. It was the Go-Hawks' fifth State Tournament appearance. Taking a 3-1 lead into the fifth, Coach Casey Klunder's gang had nine straight batters reached base after one out. Jake Velky delivered a walk-off two RBI double to end the game. The Go-Hawks recorded four singles, two doubles, one hit by pitch, and two plays in which they reached on errors during the outburst. Their 11-hit offense was keyed by two hits and two RBIs by Velky and winning hurler Alex Robson who spun a two hit, six strike out effort. Dalton Steere added two hits and an RBI for the champions who finish at 35-4. Harlan, coached by Steve Daeges, was making its fifth straight appearance finished at 28-8.
- <u>2A:</u> Clear Lake, the 3A champions in 2013, scored 11 times in the second and third innings and coasted to the championship,11-1, over Columbus Catholic, Waterloo. The Lions scored on a bases loaded walk in the second, coupled with Ben Mason's sacrifice fly and a three-run double by Mitch Keeran. Two Columbus errors and an RBI hit by winning pitcher Brock Adams highlighted a five-run third. Adams limited the Sailors to two hits while fanning six. The Lions of Coach Seth Thompson closed the season at 30-11 while Sailors under retiring Coach Don Spore ended with a 32-6 record.
- <u>1A:</u> Perennial power Newman Catholic Mason City blanked Pleasantville, 10-0 in five innings courtesy of a 10-run fifth to claim their fifth state title in 19 trips. Four of the titles have come under the guidance of Coach Tony Adams who watched his Knights lash eight hits to back up the no-hitter of Joey Verstegen who whiffed seven. Ben Fitzgerald's base full triple broke up the scoreless tie and opened the flood gates. Bryce Ball knocked in a pair of runs and led the winners with three hits. Spencer Wihlm added a two-run single in the eight-hit attack. The Knights end their summer campaign at 39-4 while Coach Sheldon Card's Pleasantville team ended a great tourney run at 35-4 and reaching the tourney for the second time.
- 2016 <u>4A:</u> In just their second state tournament appearance ever, **Prairie**, **Cedar Rapids (38-6) overcame an early 3-1 deficit** to roll past Mississippi Valley Conference rival, Iowa City, West, 12-3. The Hawks responded with 11 unanswered runs. Including a six-run fifth inning. **Alex Mixon slammed a two-run double** in the fifth and **Cal**

**Clark**, who finished with three hits singled home a run before a sacrifice fly by **Blake Viall**. A bases full walk and an error padded the fifth. Coach Todd Rima's team out hit the Trojans, 10-9. Cooper Reittinger picked up the pitching decision in relief.

- <u>3A:</u> Harlan (30-5) exorcised the memory of the 2015 championship with a 12-4 title game win over Carlisle. The Cyclones scored in five of the seven innings thanks to a 13-hit barrage in support of the six strike out mound win by Brett Croghan. Dillon Sears lashed two hits and scored four runs for the winners. Nick Tarney drove in four runs with a double and a single. Josh Cheek chipped in a triple and a single and Jared Moser tripled twice for Harlan, who had each of its starters get a base hit. Carlisle got a triple and a single from Jordan Pierce and a pair of hits from Peyton Stephens. The Wildcats, a former Class 2A champion in 2003 was making its debut in 3A.
- <u>2A:</u> Clear Lake repeated as the champion and given their 2013 Class 3A title made it three crowns in four years as they defeated Kuemper Catholic, Carroll, 8-1. The Lions of Coach Seth Thompson staked a 3-0 lead in the first inning and were never headed. The champions (31-7) had six starters with base hits with Ethan McHenry driving in a pair of runs with a triple and a single. Ben Mason pitched a four hitter with three strike outs and was never in trouble. Ben Berg had two hits for the Knights.
- <u>1A:</u> St. Mary's, Remsen roared back from a 4-2 deficit after three innings with five runs in the fourth en route to an 8-5 triumph over West Sioux, Hawarden. It was the fourth state championship for the Hawks and the first since winning consecutive titles in 1983, 1984 and 1985. Co-coaches Dean Harpeneau and Jim Wesselmann saw their team (33-5) parlay four errors with a Brady Portz single and R.J. Staab's bases loaded liner that eluded the right fielder to clear the bases. That set the stage for a nifty relief performance by Connor Clark as he fanned six and allowed just one hit in the final four innings. Clark, Staab, and Jacob Wesselmann each had a pair of hits in a 10-hit offense for the winners. The game marked the first time in the 81-year history of the summer tournament that two Class 1A teams from the same conference played for the championship.
- **2017 <u>4A:</u>** Top-seeded and number one rated **Johnston** won its fourth state title and first since 2013 as they blanked Dowling Catholic, 5-0. **Jack Dreyer** and **Andrew Nord** keyed the Dragons' triumph. Dreyer was magnificent on the mound, spinning a two-hitter that was marked by 13 strike outs and just one walk. He also went 1-for-three with a pair of RBIs. Nord went 2-for-4 with an RBI and a run scored for coach Michael Barta. The Dragons ended the season campaign with a 41-3 record. Dowling, who had a season split of two doubleheaders with Johnston, wound up 36-9.
- <u>3A:</u> Top-seeded **Assumption**, **Davenport** notched its 10th state title (most of any school regardless of class) with a 10-1 triumph over defending champion Harlan. The powerful Knights scored at least one run in each of the six at-bats with **Nolan Melchert** leading the offensive charge going 2-for-three with a double, a two-run circuit blast and a sacrifice fly giving him four RBIs for the game. **Trenton Wallace** was dominant on the mound fashioning a three-hit, 13 strike out gem for Coach Billy Argo who notched his fifth crown with Assumption. The Knights ended the season 41-5, while Harlan closed the season at 36-3.
- **2A:** Beckman Catholic, top-seeded, scored all its nine runs in the first inning and then staved off late Kuemper Catholic challenges for a 9-6 title win for their sixth championship. Veteran coach Tim Jenk, Jr., battling cancer was on hand while Fred Martin directed the team. The Blazers sent 13 batters to the plate in the first and parlayed six walks, a hit batter and three hits into an early lead. **Riley LeGrand** reached base three times on a pair of singles and a walk to key the Blazers' attack., He also pitched the final inning in relief to stymie Kuemper who scored once in the fourth and five times in th sixth. **Izak Baumhover** helped the Knights' cause by going 2-for-3 with a double, single, a walk and an RBI.
- <u>1A:</u> Newman Catholic, Mason City overcame an early 3-0 deficit to Martensdale-St. Marys as the top-rated and top-seeded Knights won their sixth title, 8-3. Coach Alex Bohl's club erupted for seven runs in the fourth highlighted by **Evan Paulus's** run scoring double and a two-run double by **Josh Thilges**. The champions also scored on a wild pitch and two more on an error. Paulus picked up the pitching win, allowing five hits and fanning five. He blanked the Blue Devils over the last four innings. **Kolton Fisk** slammed a triple and a single for the Blue Devils and **Esa Johnson** added a two-run singles. Newman closed a 35-3 slate with 12-straight wins, while Martensdale-St. Marys ended with a 41-4 record.
- **2018** <u>4A:</u> Urbandale scored early then rode a stellar pitching effort by Luke Llewellyn to blank upstart Cedar Rapids, Washington, 3-0. It was the J-Hawks' third championship run and the first since 2007. Carter Troncin

doubled in the first inning to score Brook Heinen. The pair teamed up in the third as Heinen doubled home Chris Miller and Troncin singled in Heinen. Meanwhile, Llewellyn handcuffed the eighth-seeded Warriors on two hits while striking out 13. Coach Jeremy Heinen's club closed out a 36-6 campaign while Cedar Rapids, Washington, coached by Scott Brune ended 27-18.

<u>3A:</u> Top-seeded Assumption, Davenport (34-10) notched their state record 11th state title to repeat as the 3A champions with an 11-1 six inning triumph over Harlan. The Knights exploded for six runs in the second inning and kept Harlan at bay with smothering three-hitter by Julien Broderson who fanned eight. Leadoff hitter Nick Gottilla lashed out a championship record five hits to drive in three runs for Coach Billy Argo's team. Jayce Levy added three hits to plate two runs. Argo, the architect of six championship teams and a career record of 540-201, announced his retirement after the game. The Knights, who have a state best of 37-5 in state tournament competition, outscored their three opponents, 18-2. Harlan (33-4), guided by Coach Steve Daeges, gained the title with one-run wins over Boone and Waverly-Shell Rock.

**2A:** Sixth-seeded Centerville edged top-seeded Regina, lowa City, 4-3 to claim its third state title and first in Class 2A. The Big Reds bumped third-seeded Estherville Lincoln Central, 6-3 and second-seeded Wilton, 13-0 to gain the title contest. Coach Ryan Hodges team was a semifinalist in 2017 built a 4-0 lead after six using their "small ball and running game," advancing runners into scoring position with singles and sacrifice bunts and scoring on a fielder's choices and sacrifice flies by Tiger Terpstra and Tyson Belloma. Brady Kauzlarich and McCain Oden each had two hits for the winners. Regina got a run scoring single by Ryne Schooley in the fifth and added two in the seventh on Ryan Schott's double before Terpstra tracked down a possible winning hit by Trent Hoogerwerf in left. Daniel Hargrave got the mound win allowing eight hits (six in the final three innings) while recording nine strike outs and being supported by errorless play. Nick Brandt had three hits for Coach Jeff Pacha's Royals (29-8).

<u>1A:</u> Newman Catholic, Mason City in their record 22nd tournament continued its dominance in Class 1A winning its seventh championship with a 9-5 victory over previously unbeaten Lisbon (36-1). The Knights, playing in their 11th title game, stunned the Lions with a seven-run first inning only to see Lisbon retaliate with five run third. They parlayed four hits highlighted by two-run singles from Andrew Morse and Josh Fitzgerald along with two Lisbon errors and three hit batters than yielded three runs. The Lions' five runs in the third was highlighted by a run producing double from West Benyshek, a run scoring single by Brett Givens, an RBI double by Bryce Werderman, and a two-run double off the bat of Tyson Williams. Morse steadied Newman in the fourth with a run scoring single and winning pitcher Evan Paulus blasted a solo home run over the 403' sign in center for the final run. He allowed six hits and fanned six for the hill win.
