







DIVING EXAM




TIMING AND JUDGING





DIVING CONTESTANTS


• Diving Scoresheets - Each diver shall submit a diving scoresheet, signed by both the contestant and the coach on the lines provided for those signatures, which includes the number, written description, position, degree of difficulty (with the number and degree of difficulty of the voluntary dive(s) circled or otherwise clearly identified), and order in which the dives will be attempted for all levels of the competition, preliminaries through finals.

COMMUNICATION BETWEEN THE REFEREE AND TABLE


Referee must establish a line of communication with timing system operator and meet management software operator.

starts and finishes;

number of laps completed;
entry limits;
Order of finish.

OFFICIALS STARTING MECHANICS

The starter has the responsibility to ensure that all swimmers receive a fair and equitable start.

HSAA and IGHSAU follow NFHS rules and mechanics and not USA Swimming

OFFICIALS MECHANICS – VERBAL PREPARATORY COMMANDS - BACKSTROKE START To bring the swimmers to the starting area, the announcer or referee/starter announces the event/distance/heat, "This is the 200vard medlev relay, heat 2": Referee/starter instructs the swimmers to, "Step in"; When the swimmers have surfaced, blows a long whistle to have the swimmers return to the wall and instructs the swimmers to "Place your feet": If necessary, blows whistle or asks for quiet: When swimmers are stationary, gives the command, "Take your mark"; • Observes whether or not any feet or toes are above or curling over the gutter or pool's edge; When swimmers are stationary, activates the starting signal. Note: The referee/starter may give the command, "Place your feet," after blowing the second long whistle and before giving the "Take your mark" command
