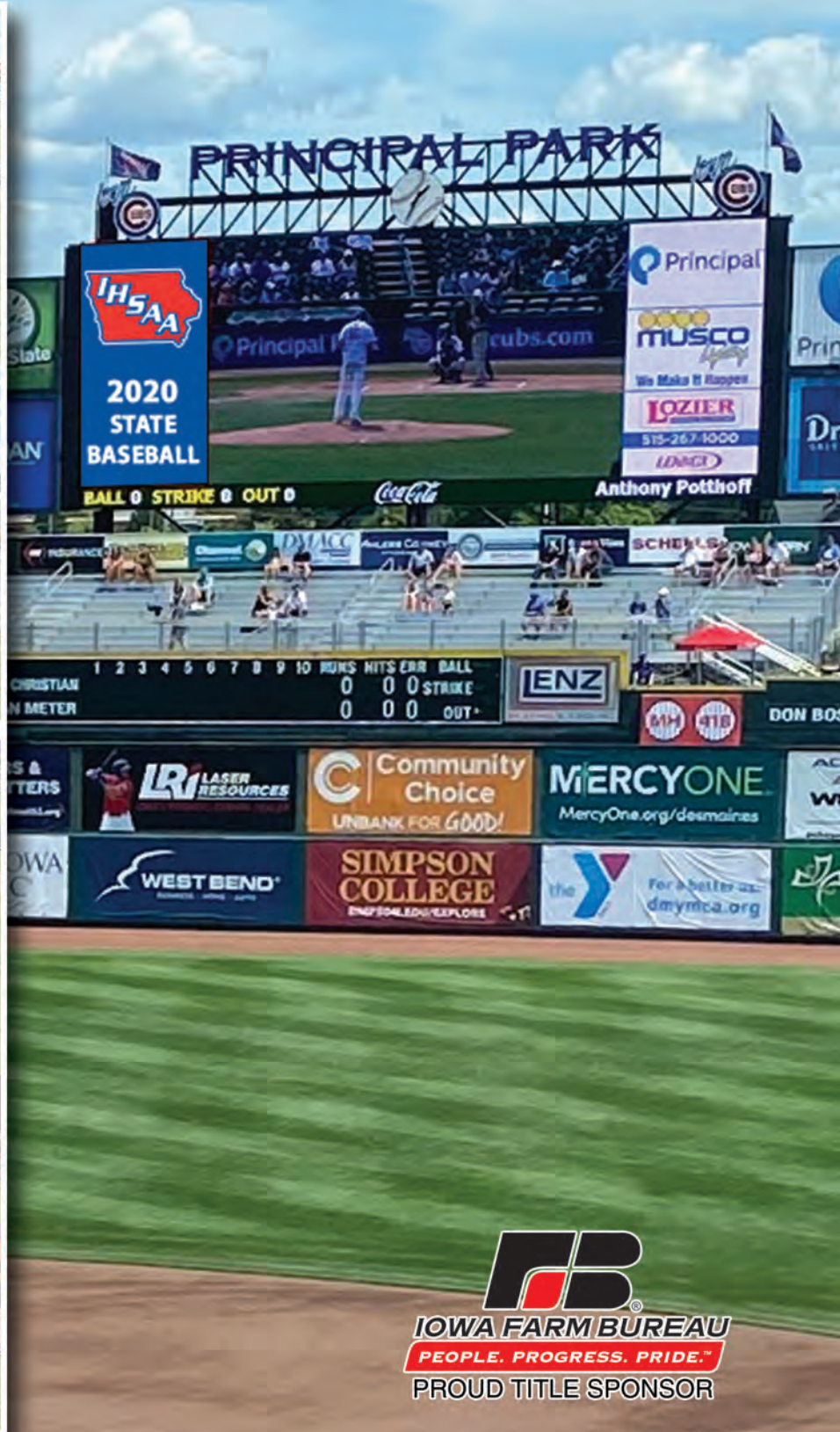
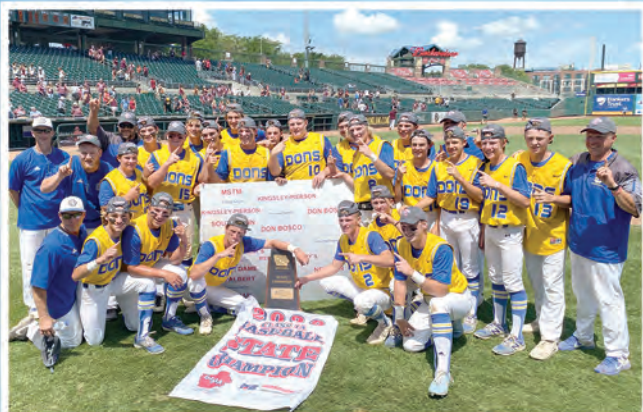

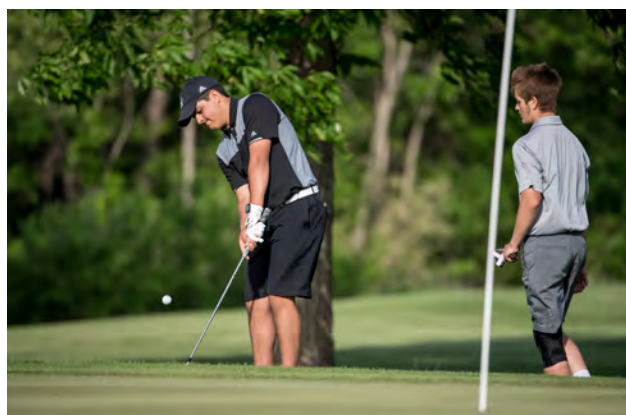

# General COVID-19 guidance for 2020 fall sports

*Updated release from July 29, 2020*

Providing information and guidance relating to COVID-19 for member schools and participants of IHSAA activities in the fall 2020 season. This document as well as sport-specific guidance for cross country, football, and Class 4A golf are available through the IHSAA website and the COVID-19 Resource Center: [iahsaa.org/covid-19](http://iahsaa.org/covid-19).

This document should be considered as providing recommendations from IHSAA & IGHSAAU for their member schools, and should not supersede guidelines, mandates, requirements, and/or orders put into place by the:

Iowa Governor's Office  
Iowa Department of Public Health  
Iowa Department of Education  
Federal, local or county government entities  
Federal, local or county health departments  
Local School Districts

## Supervision

It is the responsibility of the home team to provide proper administrative supervision (not the coach) at contests to assure compliance with the guidelines set forth by the Governor's office, the Department of Education, the Department of Public Health, the Iowa High School Athletic Association and the Iowa Girls High School Athletic Union.

## Return to Learn and Competition

All schools, regardless of district/school Return to Learn plans, will be eligible to participate in IHSAA and IGHSAAU sports programs. The decision regarding whether or not to allow teams to participate rests solely with local school districts.

Schools deciding to not participate in a boys' sport should send written notice from its superintendent or designated school official to IHSAA executive director Tom Keating by August 17.

## Eligibility for Students in Districts That Do Not Offer One or More Fall Sports

Two options exist:

1. The district not offering the sport may develop a cooperative sharing agreement with a district that does offer the sport. This may jeopardize the host school's postseason eligibility if the combined enrollment moves the host school to the next enrollment class. As per 36.15(4)(b)
2. Students in a district not offering the sport may open enroll to another district and would be immediately eligible to par-



ticipate in that sport. In such a situation, students who open enroll would be ineligible for varsity competition in all sports which their home district offers. As per 36.15(4)(a)

## Academic Eligibility

All students are considered academically eligible to begin fall sports in the 2020-21 school year. Regardless of the Return to Learn plan implemented, all students must be enrolled in at least four courses to be eligible. All other scholarship, open enrollment, general transfer rules apply.

## Pre-Participation Physicals

As per the amendment issued by Governor Reynolds on June 25, all physicals signed on or after July 1, 2019 are good through December of 2020.

Schools should use the previous PPP form for the 2020-2021 school year. The revised PPP form has not been approved for distribution.

## Return to Learn and Concussion Protocol

The Department of Education, Iowa Department of Health and Iowa Athletic Trainers Society will clarify how Return to Play (RTP) protocols relate to each of the three Return to Learn options schools may implement. The general guideline is that a day of school is a day of school, regardless of how instruction is delivered.

## Transportation

Guidelines will reflect school transportation guidelines which will come from the Department of Education.

## Possible or Positive COVID-19 Cases

The Iowa Department of Public Health is developing guidance for county health departments and schools regarding protocols when a student and/or student-athlete reports COVID-19 symptoms, a positive COVID-19 test result or contact with a person with a positive COVID-19 test result. Each school should identify a point of contact for athletes,

coaches, and other personnel to report to when he/she experiences COVID-19 symptoms, a positive COVID-19 test result or contact with a person with a positive COVID-19 test result. This identified person will be responsible to report such situations to local public health.

Each school should develop a communication plan to notify relevant persons (players, coaches, spectators) when contact-tracing indicates the need to.

### Health Screening

Schools should implement health screening for practices and games similar to methods used during baseball and softball seasons. Self-screening and reporting to the school representative (AD/Coach/Trainer, etc.) is permissible.

Any individual reporting symptoms and/or a temperature of 100.4F or higher should be isolated until they can safely transport home.

### Social Distancing

The overarching safety principal in all areas of athletic activities (meetings, practices, travel, instruction, drills, benches, spectators, locker rooms, training rooms, concessions, restrooms, etc.) is that individuals should maintain 6 feet of social distancing.

### Hand Sanitizing

Student-athletes should be encouraged to frequently sanitize their hands before, during and after practice and competition. Non-touch hand sanitizers may be used. Student-athletes should have their own personal hand sanitizer. Individuals should especially sanitize before touching "common" equipment or other items.

### Equipment Sanitizing

Any equipment that is shared by student-athletes should be sanitized before and after practice as well as before and after competition.

### Towels

Individuals should never share towels. Each individual should bring or be issued his/her own clean towel at the beginning of practice or competition. Towels should be laundered after each practice and game.

### Locker Rooms

Locker rooms may be used and should be sanitized every day and after use by each and every group. Schools should coordinate with their maintenance departments regarding

sanitizing.

All school-issued and personal clothing, equipment and other items should be taken home following practices and/or contests. Locker rooms should not be used as a storage area for clothing and/or equipment.

Players, coaches and others using locker rooms should maintain 6 feet of social distancing. This may require a rotating schedule for use of locker rooms to avoid congestion. A record of individuals in each rotation should be kept to facilitate contact-tracing if necessary.

Players, coaches and others using locker rooms are strongly encouraged to wear masks while in the locker room.

Visitor locker room should be identified and should be sanitized prior to arrival of team and after departure of team.

### Water

Each individual student-athlete should have their own water container.

If a hydration station (e.g. cooler) is provided, individuals must sanitize their hands prior to using the hydration station. An alternative practice is to assign one person to fill water bottles and that person should wear a mask and protective gloves.

Host schools may provide a water source for visitors but visitors should bring their own hydration station (cooler).

### Spectators

Schools should implement spectator protocols by following CDC and local department of health guidelines regarding size of gatherings and social distancing.

Spectators should use six feet social distancing. Families may sit or stand together but should social distance from others. Frequent reminders should be made via public address.

Just as businesses may require customers to wear masks, schools may require spectators to wear masks.

### Press Box or Scorer's Bench

These areas should be limited to, in order of priority:

Essential personnel: Scorekeeper, scoreboard operator, announcer

Home and visitor coaching staffs (football)

Media (as per guidelines below)

Individuals in the press box and/or at scorer's table should practice six feet social distancing.

### Media

Schools should communicate with media regarding protocols for practices and games. It is recommended that:

Space be provided for media game coverage that takes into consideration:

Six feet of social distancing

Priority given to: 1) home team coverage; 2) visiting team coverage; 3) other coverage.

Procedure be established regarding interview requests prior to/after practices and games, including

Identifying an area where interviews will be conducted.

Establishing a required advanced notice time-frame.

### Concession Stands

The Iowa Department of Inspections and Appeals provides guidance on school concession stands, with the latest update for August 24. If concession stands are open, patrons should practice 6 feet of social distancing.

### Training Rooms

All individuals utilizing the training room should wear a face mask at all times.

Host site athletic training room should not be available for visiting team pregame and postgame treatments.

If a team travels without an athletic trainer, all pregame taping, bracing, etc., should be completed before departure to the game. Host site athletic trainer should be contacted prior to the trip to plan for any requested accommodations.

All taping/exam tables should be disinfected before and after each use.

All taping/exam tables should be distanced at least 6 feet apart.

Cold and hot tubs should only be used by one individual at a time.

Cold and hot tubs should be drained, cleaned and disinfected between individual use and at the beginning and end of every day.

### Participation Levels

This guidance is intended for high school varsity, subvarsity, and junior high school activities as overseen by the IHSAA. Subvarsity and junior high sports are approved to resume IHSAA activities in the 2020-21 school year.

# Football schedules revised for 2020 regular season

Updated release from July 24, 2020

To better prepare for the 2020 varsity football season, the IHSAA developed a revised schedule plan which allows for member school adjustments due to COVID-19. Football remains the only Iowa high school sport with regular season schedules and postseason qualifying managed by the IHSAA. The revised plan considers flexibility for school return concerns, geography, postseason qualifying, transportation, and possible COVID-19 cases as rationale for changing previously announced varsity football schedules.

The first practice (August 10) and first competition (August 27) dates are currently unchanged in this revision, as are the weeks for state semifinals (November 13-15) and finals (November 20-21).

This revised plan was approved by the Board of Control on Friday. The IHSAA plans to release further fall season and sport-specific guidance next week. Team schedules will be compiled and released when available.

## 2020 Scheduling Plan

**REGULAR SEASON:** A seven-week regular season will be conducted. Teams will have the option of scheduling five, six, or seven games within those seven weeks.

**POSTSEASON:** All teams in all classes will qualify for the postseason. Brackets will consist of six rounds for each classification. The IHSAA will determine postseason pairings with geography, quality, and team availability as primary considerations. This is intended to be a one-time measure for postseason formatting.

**OPTIONAL DATES:** Week 1 and Week 2 will be optional game dates. Opponents, locations, and participation may be determined by member schools in 11-player football.

**RPI FORMULA:** With all teams allowed entry into the postseason, the Ratings Percentage Index will not be utilized in 2020 to determine at-large berths or seeding.

**DISTRICT GAMES:** Teams in Classes 3A, 2A, 1A, and A will play their scheduled district games in the previously established order. This change means the prior Week 5 becomes Week 3, Week 6 becomes Week 4, etc., in this revised plan.

**CLASS 4A:** Participating schools will schedule their own regular season games. The previously announced group format and success model will not be implemented in 2020. The IHSAA encourages conferences to collaborate in creating their schedules.

**EIGHT-PLAYER:** Teams will play Week 3 through Week 9 of their previously announced schedules in what is now Week 1 through Week 7. Due to the number of teams in the classification, Eight-Player has opponents scheduled on the optional dates of Week 1 and Week 2. Teams in Eight-Player may opt out of those contests, but may not change opponents or locations unless an agreement is reached with all participating teams and the IHSAA.

**MISSING GAMES:** Due to the potential of positive COVID-19 cases forcing players and teams to miss games in the 2020 regular season, the revised plan does not penalize teams with a loss or forfeit due to state, county, or local health department determinations. A missed game due to COVID-19 will be considered a "no contest" and will not be made up. Teams may work with the IHSAA and new possible opponents should they have open dates due to scheduled opponents missing games.

**OUT OF STATE GAMES:** Teams with scheduled games against out of state opponents may attempt to reschedule those contests during the optional Week 1 or Week 2.

**TEAM PARTICIPATION:** Providing for start dates as currently scheduled, the IHSAA requests member schools state their intent to participate in football's regular season and postseason by August 17.

# Baseball

## Unforgettable summer, state tournament amid pandemic-shortened 2020 season

It was the season that somehow happened. And despite a delayed start, shortened schedule, challenges from the COVID-19 pandemic, and some teams facing delays or withdrawals, Iowa high school baseball (and softball for girls) was the first organized team sport back on the field in the United States in summer 2020.

The student-athletes, coaches, umpires, school administrators, medical personnel, school staff, and parents and fans made a litany of health and safety adjustments throughout the summer. It resulted in the 2020 IHSAA State Baseball Tournament being played on-time and on-site at Principal Park in Des Moines, wrapping up with the four scheduled championship games on Saturday, August 1.

The IHSAA's spring sports were canceled in March after state government canceled in-person schooling and activities, and summer sports seemed headed for a similar fate in April and May. Once high school baseball and softball were given the greenlight on May 20 for a June 1 practice start and June 15 games, teams raced to get ready and pack a whole summer's worth of action and memories into just a few weeks. There were new sanitary and safety measures across the state, and positive COVID-19 tests and exposures to the virus sidelined several teams. Ultimately, 12 of the 338 participating teams were forced to withdraw from the postseason due to the virus.

With masks and sanitizing and social distancing recommendations in place, the state tournament was played at an otherwise empty Principal Park – Minor League Baseball had its season canceled – with fewer than 2,000 seats available and open for spectators, with reserved single-game tickets designed for a safe stadium setup. The overall tournament experience was certainly altered, but teams were thrilled to be taking the field and played eight days of thrilling baseball to wrap up an unforgettable summer season.

## Baseball

More details from the tournament are below...

Johnston won its third state baseball championship of the last eight years in the Class 4A final. Coach Michael Barta's deep Dragons edged out CIML foe Ankeny in a high-scoring final after taking a rematch of the 2019 final over rival Urbandale in the previous night's semifinal. Three of the seven games were decided by just one run, including both of Ankeny's earlier round wins.

Norwalk held on for its third title win in Class 3A with an 8-6 contest over fellow Central Iowa squad Gilbert. The Warriors allowed five runs in the seventh inning to make Principal Park anxious by the finish, but won with a second strong state tournament pitching performance from Tucker Christensen. A weird week (in a strange season) was capped by a delayed start to Friday's semifinals as a Gilbert player was locked inside a dugout bathroom. The Tigers then went out and scored 14 runs against top remaining seed Dallas Center-Grimes.

Van Meter repeated as Class 2A champions with a win over West Central Conference rival Des Moines Christian. Se-

nior Anthony Potthoff didn't allow a run in either of his tense starts for the Bulldogs, starting with an extra-innings quarterfinal over Treynor, then a tough Lions squad. Des Moines Christian was taken to extra innings in the semifinals by 2019 runner-up North Linn, which seemed to be playing with play-off magic in its two thrilling contests.

Don Bosco, Gilbertville won championships this school year in football and wrestling, but were more unlikely as baseball winners with a supremely deep field and three-time defending champ Newman Catholic, Mason City waiting. The Dons won Class 1A on Saturday morning, taking their first baseball title since 1978 in the process. Newman escaped St. Albert, Council Bluffs in the quarterfinals, then an extra-innings defensive battle with powerhouse St. Mary's, Remsen in the semifinals.

**CALL TO ORDER** - The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Earleywine at 8:30 a.m.

**EXECUTIVE SESSION** - (MM-S) Schwamman-Cook to proceed to executive session to discuss a personnel matter. (MM-S) Wiebers-Cook to adjourn the Executive Session.

### CONSENT ITEMS

**ALBIA COACH VIOLATION & CORRECTIVE ACTION** - Executive Director Keating presented correspondence from and response to Albia High School regarding their head boys basketball coach coaching with an expired authorization during the 2019-20 basketball season.

**2020-21 UNIFIED ACTIVITIES CALENDAR** - Assistant Director Tharp presented the 2020-21 Unified Activities Calendar.

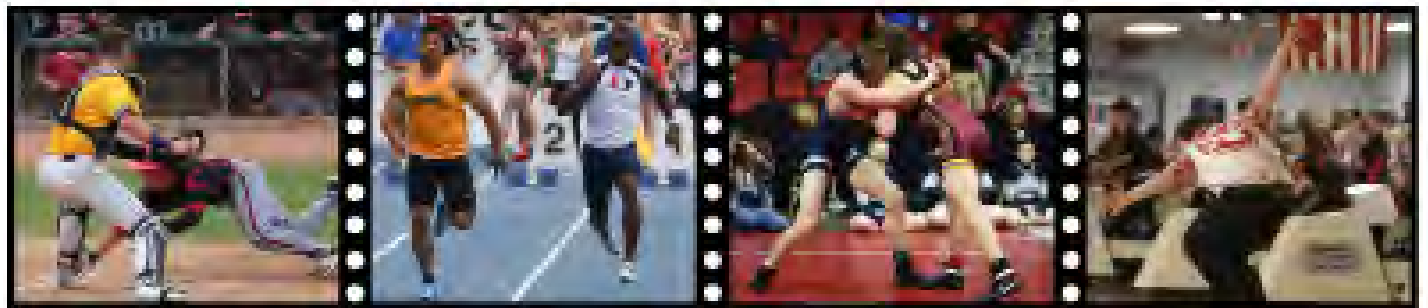
