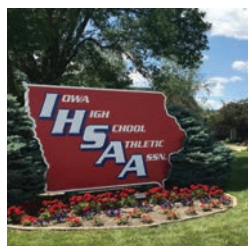

Board Briefs: August 10, 2021

Three recommendations from the joint committees of the Iowa High School Athletic Association and Iowa Girls High School Athletic Union have been recently approved by both boards for boys and girls competition in basketball, bowling, and track and field.

The IHSAA's Board of Control unanimously voted the measures through at their annual summer meetings from Aug. 5-7, which will affect the bowling postseason and track and field schedule in the 2021-22 school year, and basketball in 2022-23.

Basketball: Shot clock added for 2022-23

The IHSAA and IGHSAAU will use the NFHS allowance for state adoption to introduce a 35-second shot clock for varsity basketball, required of participating member schools starting in the 2022-23 season. Use of the shot clock in sub-varsity competition will be allowed but not required. With a date set for statewide implementation, experimental exceptions will not be granted during the 2021-22 regular season.

To encourage standardization among states, 35 seconds was the timing provided by NFHS approval. Further shot clock information and rule implementation will be provided by IHSAA and IGHSAAU as it becomes available ahead of the 2022-23 season.

Bowling: Postseason adds individual tournament

Starting in the 2021-22 season, the state meet and state qualifying meets will both team and individual tournaments. Team events will feature baker games, then a bracketed format at the state meet. Individual tournaments will be three games, including a bracket for the top eight individuals at the state meet.



Details on host sites, qualifiers, and games will be provided by the IHSAA and IGHSAAU before the start of the 2021-22 season.

Bowling classifications for boys and girls have also been changed to move the largest 32 programs by enrollment to Class 3A, the next largest 32 programs to Class 2A, and the remaining teams to Class 1A.

Track & Field: Earlier start date in spring 2022

Following recommendations from the joint track and field advisory committee, the start date for the 2022 season has been updated to allow for more practice time ahead of spring competition. The first practice date will now be Monday, February 21, ahead of the previous date of Monday, February 28. The first competition date will remain Monday, March 7.

Schlicht added amid summer staffing changes



The IHSAA's first new full-time employee since 2017 became administrative assistant Whitney Schlicht with her start in the officials' department in September. Schlicht, an Ogden native, replaces Laura Brooker, who served as an administrative assistant and eventually assistant to the director of officials for 18 years.

Schlicht lives in Ogden with her husband David and two children, Brooklyn and Brody, and enjoys racing and watching her kids' activities. She will manage officials registrations, contracts, database managements, and other support staff

Also departing the IHSAA for new opportunities this summer was Iowa Hall of Pride director Taylor Anderson, who accepted a position at the Iowa Girls High School Athletic Union. Anderson started at the downtown Des Moines museum and event space in 2017 and led the Hall of Pride staff through new digital projects and technological developments.

Varsity Bound partners on new IHSAA database

The Iowa High School Athletic Association is excited to partner with Varsity Bound to provide a member school software database for sport administration starting in the 2021-22 athletic year.

Varsity Bound has managed Quik Stats Iowa on behalf of the IHSAA and Iowa Girls High School Athletic Union and will now expand its member school services to include the IHSAA's database and directory.

"The Varsity Bound team has modernized how our member schools input sports data and have considered athletic director and coach use every step of the way," IHSAA executive director Tom Keating said. "This is a positive partnership that will allow our member schools to update their teams, coaches, student-athletes, and IHSAA and IGHSAA management all in one place."

Coaches and administrators with Varsity Bound accounts will receive internal messages from the IHSAA and Varsity Bound during the database update.

The first IHSAA database feature available through Varsity Bound will be confirmations for the annual online NFHS Concussion Course, which opened for on July 1 for the 2021-22 school year and requires member schools to enter all active coach names and Board of Educational Examiner folder numbers. The IHSAA's fall sports programs will be utilizing services at Varsity Bound as they become available.



"We are excited to be deepening our partnership with IHSAA, building software that helps bring our communities and state together around high school sports," said Sam Schill, co-founder of Varsity Bound.

Direct links to the new Varsity Bound database and requested materials will remain available through the IHSAA's Coaches & Administrators page. Once logged in, users will be able to select the IHSAA logo from the menu bar to view IHSAA forms and information.

The new Iowa Center for Officials Services will host both IHSAA and IGHSAA officials accounts through the NFHS-supported DragonFly software. Information on ICOS and account information is located on the IHSAA's Officials page.

Customer support for Quik Stats Iowa and the IHSAA database will continue to be managed by Varsity Bound.

Digital ticketing fees cut for 2021-22

Spectators purchasing digital tickets will pay flat and listed pricing to the Iowa High School Athletic Association's postseason lead-up events during the 2021-22 athletic year.

The IHSAA began utilizing HomeTown Ticketing in February 2021 to provide digital tickets for select postseason events, with each ticket carrying additional fees for service and credit card processing.

Starting with the 2021 fall golf state tournament, the IHSAA will absorb those fees on every ticket so that fans may attend at the listed price of \$6, \$8, or \$10 per ticket, depending on the event.

"Digital tickets receive positive feedback from our postseason sites, but the processing fees have been frustrating for our fans and member schools," IHSAA executive director Tom Keating said. "We will take on those fees for 2021-22 and try to provide an even easier ticket-buying experience so that what you see is what you get."

The ticketing measure was approved at the Board of Control meeting on Sept. 17. Processing fees paid by spectators for the digital ticketing service and credit card processing in the 2020-21 winter, spring, and summer postseasons went directly to those services and were not received as income by the IHSAA.

HomeTown Ticketing is the official ticketing partner of the IHSAA, with digital tickets used at boys' postseason lead-up events in baseball, basketball, football, soccer, swimming, and wrestling, and other select boys' and co-ed state tournaments and state qualifying events.

Ticket prices for regular season events are set by member schools or host sites. The IHSAA receives no revenue from regular season activities and operates without the use of tax monies.

Track & Field

Spectators fill up Drake Stadium in wild return week

After a canceled 2020 season and planned restrictions at Drake Stadium for the 2021 state meet, schools and spectators celebrated an open and "normal" championship as COVID-19 guidelines changed nationwide the week of the event. That made the May 20-22 meet an outstanding comeback for track and field and for statewide fans, with crowds totaling 38,611 for the second-best attendance mark ever for the three-day co-ed state meet.

Tight team races and distance sweeps highlighted the 116th year of state track and field for Iowa high school boys, with Cedar Falls (4A), Pella (3A), Underwood (2A), and Madrid (1A) all winning titles by 10 or fewer team points in their classification.

Cedar Falls sealed its second championship in program history with senior and Drake Relays outstanding athlete T.J. Tomlyanovich winning the 400 and anchoring wins in the 4x400 and distance medley relays. Pella won its fourth team title by rallying its deep squad and claiming wins in the 4x400, 4x800, and shot put with Kody Huisman. Underwood's first ever team championship came with a 66 to 60 team score over local rival Treynor, and the Eagles won the 200 and 400 through Brayden Wollan and the 4x400 with Wollan at anchor. Madrid's seventh title, now second-most in 1A history, was its first since wrapping up a three-peat from 2009-11.

Distance sweeps came in 3A, 2A, and 1A as the state's top runners held on in impressive fashions during the varied races. Two-time cross country champ Nate Mueller from ADM, Adel won the 800, 1,600, and 3,200 races and helped the Tigers finish second as a team in 3A. Bellevue's Brady Griebel did the same thing in 2A, and Madrid's Jason Renze



pulled the sweep in 1A.

Waukee's Evan Correll became just the second competitor in state wheelchair history to sweep his four events, following Johnston's E.J. Runyan (1997-2000) to four meet medals and a team title with his performance. Correll set new state meet records in all four wins - 100, 200, 400, and the recently resumed 800 - and Union's Sam Spore claimed the lone other wheelchair event championship.

Other multi-event individual champions from the three-day meet included: Dowling Catholic's Mikey McClain (100, 200), Cedar Rapids, Kennedy's Drew Bartels (400 hurdles, long jump), Charles City's Ian Collins (high jump, long jump), Cooper DeJean of OABCIG (100, long jump), Jesup's Carson Lienau (shot put, discus), and Lisbon's Kole Becker (110 hurdles, 400 hurdles, long jump).

Golf

New names, close Class 2A race highlight 2021 championships

In a unique bounceback season for Iowa's spring golf schools, new names filled the leaderboards and took the podiums in Marshalltown (Class 3A), Fort Dodge (Class 2A), and Newton (Class 1A). And for the first time since 2018, the participating schools and individuals got to complete all 36 holes in their championships, with several races coming down to the final few strokes.

Gilbert (3A) and AGWSR, Ackley (1A) were first-time team champions and were convincing winners over two days. Both squads posted the top scores at their respective sites on both days, with Gilbert placing three golfers in the top 10 and AGWSR two.

Waverly-Shell Rock junior Hogan Hansen and Beckman Catholic, Dyersville sophomore Nathan Offerman picked up their wins by two strokes each. Hansen held a tight lead throughout his run at Elmwood Country Club, while Offerman used a two-under second round to become Beckman's first ever individual golf champion.

Soccer

Eastern Iowa squads claim titles in return to Cownie

DES MOINES, Iowa - After a year away from high school soccer due to COVID-19 and a canceled 2020 spring season, Iowa's top programs plugged away to prepare for their next shot at Cownie Soccer Park. The 2021 state tournament showcased that work, with two teams winning titles on their first trips to Des Moines, and a powerhouse adding another trophy to their case in impressive fashion.

Pleasant Valley claimed the Class 3A championship in its tournament debut, winning three straight games at Cownie by the same 1-0 score. The Spartans used outstanding defense, led by all-tournament team captain Jack Roemer, and timely goals to beat tourney regulars Prairie, Johnston, and Iowa City, West.

Xavier, Cedar Rapids claimed its eighth championship and played in its 11th title game in the process, not allowing a goal to Marion, ADM, or Bondurant-Farrar. The win marks the fifth title under head coach Amir Hadzic and was Xavier's third title appearance in the last four played seasons.

Like Pleasant Valley in 3A, Notre Dame/West Burlington made its debut down in Class 1A and still found the mettle to win three games on hot days in Des Moines. The Nikes scored four goals against three straight parochial opponents



in Columbus Catholic, Regina, and Western Christian.

The 2021 tournament was the first time the event has been held with scheduled gap days for rest, recovery, and travel of participating teams. With quarterfinals on June 1, semifinals on June 3, and finals on Saturday, June 5, the games were well-played on the Cownie grass, and the outlined schedule allowed for full capacity contests with no significant COVID-19 restrictions. Saturday's finals were played with hydration breaks due to high heat indexes.

Baseball

Split sites in Carroll, Iowa City produce thrilling 2021 tournament



After Iowa high school baseball (and softball for girls) was successful as the first organized team sport back on the field in the United States in summer 2020, it had a high bar to clear in 2021. It began the spring still needing a state tournament venue as well, with Principal Park, host site since 2005, unavailable due to MLB scheduling for Minor League contests. Once the IHSAA was able to announce in June that the tournament would be split to Merchants Park in Carroll and

Duane Banks Field on the campus of the University of Iowa in Iowa City, the state's top teams were on a mission to experience those venues and raise trophies.

Carroll hosted Classes 2A and 1A from July 26-29, and Iowa City held Classes 4A and 3A from July 28-31, with the staggered schedule featuring daytime starts for finals.

St. Albert emerged from a loaded 1A field and held off traditional power Kee, Lansing in the final to win its fourth title, and first since 1999 in Carroll. Van Meter powered in 23 runs in three days to win its third straight 2A title, showcasing its depth in a controlled championship game over upstart Centerville.

Marion and Pleasant Valley endured pressure from the heat on the turf and packed crowds at Duane Banks Field to win their programs' first titles in 3A and 4A. After close games on Thursday and Friday, Pleasant Valley poured runs in on defending champion Johnston to win 4A. Marion and long-time coach Steve Fish escaped an excellent Wahlert Catholic, Dubuque squad and needed a sacrifice fly from freshman star Myles Davis to cross the plate and claim first-place in 3A.

The proposal is that each player keeps their own card and serves as a marker for all others in the group. At the end of the round, the players then simply compare cards and turn in their own card after it has been attested to by all in the group. Each card requires the signature of all members in the group.

Recommendation Number Two: The advisory committee proposes that a scrimmage be allowed in high school boys' golf similar to other sports. The scrimmage would be played under normal rules or used for a special format (alternate, best shot, etc.). Scrimmage parameters must adhere to the scrimmage guidance of the IHSAA. Scrimmages between member schools shall be permitted between the date of first legal practice and the final day of State Tournament play.

Recommendation Number Three: The committee proposes that in postseason play if the home team (hosting as indicated by the IHSAA) has one or both of the at-large individual qualifiers, then a third at-large individual qualifier and all ties should advance to the next round of play.
