IHSAA, IGHSAU introduce Family Week in 2021

Updated release from April 12, 2021

The Iowa High School Athletic Association and Iowa Girls High School Athletic Union have an upcoming "Family Week" appearing in Iowa's Unified Activity Federation calendar for the first time in 2020-21. This week will prohibit any coach and/or teacher contact with student-athletes and prohibits any IHSAA or IGHSAU event from occurring.

This non-contact period will run from Sunday, July 25, 2021 through Sunday, August 1, 2021. Those dates have been approved and listed on the Unified Activity Calendar throughout the 2020-21 athletic year, and they coincide with week 3 and week 4 of the NFHS calendar.

"Both the IHSAA and IGHSAU strongly support the introduction of 'Family Week' into our schedules," IHSAA executive director Tom Keating said.

"This will provide a built-in break for everyone involved in Iowa high school athletics — participants, parents, coaches, officials, and school administrators — and an opportunity to prioritize family, friends, rest, and activities away from sports," IGHSAU executive director Jean Berger said.

The IHSAA's 2021 state baseball tournament will be exempt from this year's non-contact period. Future state baseball tournaments will have updated schedules to allow for the off week before the start of the next athletic year.

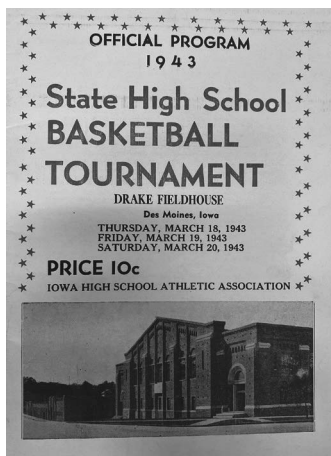


There can be no athletic activities within IHSAA and IGHSAU member schools during that week. All high school students, including incoming ninth graders, are covered under the non-contact period. Contact with coaches is not to occur on or off school premises. The use of school facilities is prohibited during the eight-day period.

In summary: No intentional or scheduled contact between any student-athlete and coach from their school at any place, at any time, and for any purpose during the prohibited period.

Iowa's Unified Activity Federation is comprised of the Iowa High School Athletic Association, the Iowa Girls High School Athletic Union, the Iowa High School Music Association, and the Iowa High School Speech Association.

Governor's Scholar in-person again in April

DES MOINES, Iowa – Hundreds of Iowa's highest academically achieving high school seniors were honored on Sunday, April 25 at Hy-Vee Hall in downtown Des Moines for the 19th annual Governor's Scholar recognition ceremony.

The Governor's office, the Iowa High School Athletic Association, and the Iowa Farm Bureau team up to present this program each year.

Governor Kim Reynolds and Lt. Governor Adam Gregg hosted the event and addressed an audience that included more than 300 of the 424 students and their two selected family members or supporters at a socially-distanced event.

The seniors were selected by their high schools as outstanding academic representatives, and more than 99



percent of the group were active participants in extracurricular activities at their high schools, including athletics, fine arts, and more.

Fall: Golf

Waukee wins third straight title in 4A's first trip to DMGCC

WEST DES MOINES, Iowa – The first IHSAA state golf championship contested at the prestigious Des Moines Golf & Country Club was a crowning weekend for Class 4A power Waukee in its final season with one high school varsity team.

The Warriors and head coach John Kotz won their third consecutive team championship and seventh in the last 11 years with 4A's fall meet. They swept the top of the individual podium too, as senior Jack Starr and junior Brock Seiser finished first and second after 36 holes. Starr shot an even 72 on Saturday, Oct. 10, including an eagle on the 498-yard No. 9. That allowed him to hold off his teammate Seiser by one stroke, as well as 2019 medalist Dillon Burr of Linn-Mar, Marion.

Waukee's last two titles have come in Coralville and Polk City, but the 2020 trophy was won closer to home at DMGCC. Waukee will split into two high schools, with the new Waukee Northwest joining Class 4A in 2021. The win gave Kotz's squad five of the last seven championships in 4A, and oddly, the last two state golf titles overall. With the cancellation of the spring 2020 season due to COVID-19 and statewide school closures, the two most recent seasons of IHSAA golf were the 2019 fall and 2020 fall campaigns.

Pleasant Valley finished as team runner-up for the second time in the last three seasons, paced by three top 10 finishers in Jack Dumas, Nathan Tillman, and Jack Roemer. All three stayed under 80 for each of their rounds and fired 155 or better over the two-day event. Dumas hit five birdies in his second round to complete his high school career with a 73. Ankeny's Hunter Johnson, who finished fourth,

matched Dumas with seven total birdies across the 36 holes. Johnston's Jarred Bowser shared a 151 two-day scored with Dumas.

On a weekend in which Waukee led by 15 strokes going into Day 2, Cedar Falls, Johnston, and Ankeny rounded out the top five team scores. Ames individual qualifier Sam Vertanen led the meet overnight after a 74 on Day 1, and finished seventh overall. He was followed by Ottumwa individual Cale Leonard in eighth.

An announcement on the 2021 Class 4A state tournament site will be made following the spring meets in Class 3A, 2A, and 1A. Their events are set for Marshalltown, Fort Dodge, and Newton.

Fall: Cross Country

North's first title, 3A repeats, and Madrid three-peat cap two-day meet in Fort Dodge

FORT DODGE, Iowa – The 42nd year of co-ed state cross country championships saw a change in format since the meet's move to Fort Dodge as COVID-19 precautions turned the five kilometer meet into a two-day event. The adjustment bumped up qualifying meet dates and state meet dates with Class 4A and Class 3A boys and girls competing at Lakeside Golf Course on Friday, Oct. 30, and Class 2A and Class 1A boys and girls running on Saturday, Oct. 31. Despite the changes, smaller crowds on the course, and more time between events, the top boys' and girls' runners in the state cut through the wind for an exciting meet.



CLASS 4A: Sioux City, North won its first ever team and individual title in a boys' sweep thanks to coach Abdier Marrero's squad and champion Jaysen Bouwers. Bouwers was joined the award deck by teammate Will Lohr, whose fourth-place finish helped the Stars hold off two-time defending champ Dowling Catholic. The Maroons were seeking their seventh title in the last 10 years, but finished Friday as runner-up with three runners in the top 15 scores.

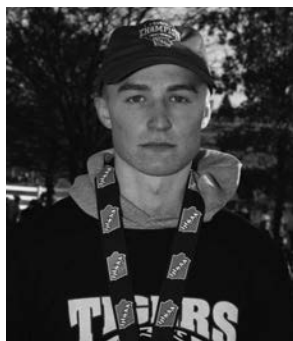
CLASS 3A: Dallas Center-Grimes repeated as team champion, with time to spare from the 2019 win by just one point. Aidan Ramsey paced the Mustangs who had three of the same scorers from last year's title. It was a repeat finish in the individual event as well, with ADM, Adel's Nate Mueller posting the weekend's top time and claiming his second title in 15:28.7. Mueller finished around 20 seconds ahead of Humboldt's standout Quinton Orr, who became just the second boys' runner ever to finish runner-up at the state cross country meet three times.

CLASS 2A: Caleb Shumaker finished third to pace his Tipton squad to a team championship in 2019, and followed that up on Saturday with a championship of his own. Shumaker ran clear in 16:13.2 and helped Tipton take home a runner-up trophy. The team title went to Danville/New London for the first time, logging an impressive 64 points in a crowded 2A field. Danville/New London had the second- and third-place finishers in Ty Carr and Alexander Julian leading the way to the win.

CLASS 1A: Madrid and coach Kelley Grothus won their third straight team title with their lowest team score in the three-peat. The Tigers had three runners, including runner-up Clay Pehl, placing in the top 10 overall. Bellevue's Brady Griebel won the final race of the weekend in 15:52.2, improving his runner-up performance in 2A back in 2019. Three of the top four teams were West Central Conference squads, including Madrid, runner-up Earlham, and fourth-place ACGC.

Wild 2020 schedule and all-in playoff format finishes in exciting fashion at UNI-Dome

CEDAR FALLS, Iowa – A year turned upside-down by COVID-19 forced adjustments from start to finish of the 2020 football season. From schedules being adjusted in late July to accommodate for travel concerns, spectator restrictions, and an emergency all-in playoff format, to the UNI-Dome going from limited fans then just two tickets per player from the semifinals to the finals, Iowa's players and teams had to be ready for anything. And based on the results and some record-breaking performances, they did just that.

Every team got an opportunity to start in the playoffs after a seven-week regular season. This edition of the "playoffs" would start in the previously determined Round of 16, but it was a long road to the UNI-Dome for all involved.

CLASS 4A: Ankeny halted the Dowling Catholic dynasty in a double overtime semifinal classic, then stopped surging Southeast Polk in the final to claim their first football championship since 2012. The Hawks took control in the second half of the final with quarterback Jase Bauer (top right) rushing for 158 yards and throwing for 101 more on a talented squad.

CLASS 3A: North Scott, Eldridge trekked through top 3A competition on the way to its first ever state football championship. A physical semifinal overtime win over perennial power Xavier, Cedar Rapids sealed the Lancers' contender status, then they intercepted seven passes against Harlan Community in an emphatic 30-6 final.

CLASS 2A: Waukon was the class of 2A yet again, appearing in their third final in the last four years. The Indians slowed down PCM, Monroe and the state's highest-scoring offense in the semis, then topped Central Lyon/George Little Rock for their second crown under coach Chad Beermann.

CLASS 1A: A thriller of a title game went to OABCIG and for the second straight year, as star Cooper DeJean boosted his squad to a comeback win over Van Meter. OABCIG trailed 26-18 and scored two touchdowns in the last 90 seconds to take the instant classic, 33-26.

CLASS A: Regina, Iowa City rolled to their eighth football title and seventh in the last 11 years with coach Marv Cook. In UNI-Dome wins over Saint Ansgar and Grundy Center, the Regals were paced by the state's all-time leader in career receptions Alex Wick and eight rushing scores from Theo Kolie.

EIGHT-PLAYER: St. Mary's, Remsen won a record-shattering shootout in the semifinals against Montezuma, 108-94, and followed it up with a title game shutout of Fremont-Mills.

Waukee wins third title in meet moved to Linn-Mar

MARION, Iowa – COVID-19 closures forced a change in venue for the 2021 IHSAA State Swimming Championships after two record-setting meets at the University of Iowa's Campus Recreation and Wellness Center. By early January, Linn-Mar, Marion stepped up and was announced as the alternate site for the event. Capacity limits meant the meet was only open to participants and meet personnel, with spectators forced to watch on TV or online, but the competition stayed fierce inside the impressive aquatic center.

Waukee won its third team title and first since 2017 as coach Dan Briggs' squad placed in the top three of all three relay events and won two individual titles with Andrew Reiter. The victories came cleanly in the 200-yard individual medley and the 100 butterfly a few minutes later. The Warriors needed a full team effort to pull away from 2019 champion Ankeny and 2020 champion Iowa City, West for the win.

Ankeny's Trent Frandson rounded out a stellar varsity career by collecting his third consecutive championships in both the 200 freestyle and the 500 freestyle. Those victories came by three and nearly five seconds against the other top swimmers in the state. Frandson was also part of Ankeny's

200 freestyle relay and 400 freestyle relay teams to close his final meet with four golds.

Bettendorf's Alex Stone followed up former teammate Charlie Bunn's sprint wins with a double of his own in the 50 freestyle and 100 freestyle. Aiden Carstensen gave Linn-Mar a home win in the 100 backstroke. And Sioux City Metro's Kohen Rankin won the 100 breaststroke to take home the first gold to a Sioux City individual in over 20 years.

Six other wrestlers won their third titles, including three juniors who will have an opportunity to come back and claim their fourth round of medals and brackets and championship caps next year, Hayden Taylor, Robert Avila, Jr., Drake Ayala, Aidan Noonan, Carter Fousek, Marcel Lopez.

with heavyweight Griffin Liddle. Fort Dodge's Drake Ayala was an individual highlight of the 3A field, wrapping up a legendary career with his third championship and winning all four state tournament matches by bonus points.

CLASS 2A: Coach Jeff Voss and West Delaware used their deep and dangerous lineup to return to the top of the pile in 2A, winning their second trophy in the last three seasons. The Hawks had two individual champions at 195 and 285 with Wyatt Voelker and Carson Petlon, but racked up points over runner-up Osage and third-place Independence through 11 qualifiers and placewinners.

Matthew Lewis was the showcase of a highly anticipated 2A finals round, holding on to a 3-2 decision over Osage's Nick Fox to win his fourth title, this time at 145. Two other juniors in 2A won their third titles as well: Crestwood's Carter Fousek

and Solon's Hayden Taylor kept their sterling career marks rolling with impressive performances at The Well. Webster City's Camron Phetxoumphone also repeated as a champ, this time up at 113.

CLASS 1A: Don Bosco dominated en route to its 13th team title and third straight, sending coach Tom Hogan out with a slew of championships and record marks. The Dons brought 12 qualifiers and won two individual titles through twins Cade and Carson Tenold, adding to their dual team title on Wednesday. Three three-timers were in the 1A field as well, with Cascade's Aidan Noonan capping his varsity career with a third title and unbeaten senior season. New London's Marcel

Lopez and Lisbon's Robert Avila Jr. also topped the podium for the third time and will be back in 2022 to complete the career sweep. North Butler/Clarksville heavyweight Chet Buss repeated as well and could win his third at 285 pounds next season.

DUALS: Wednesday's state tournament week opener was won by a pack of familiar powerhouses: Waverly-Shell Rock, West Delaware, and Don Bosco all won three straight duals, including finals over rival squads to take home hardware. West Delaware won its third straight in 2A, while both Waverly-Shell Rock and Don Bosco avenged losses in the 2019 finals over Southeast Polk and Lisbon to return to the top of the trophy hunt.

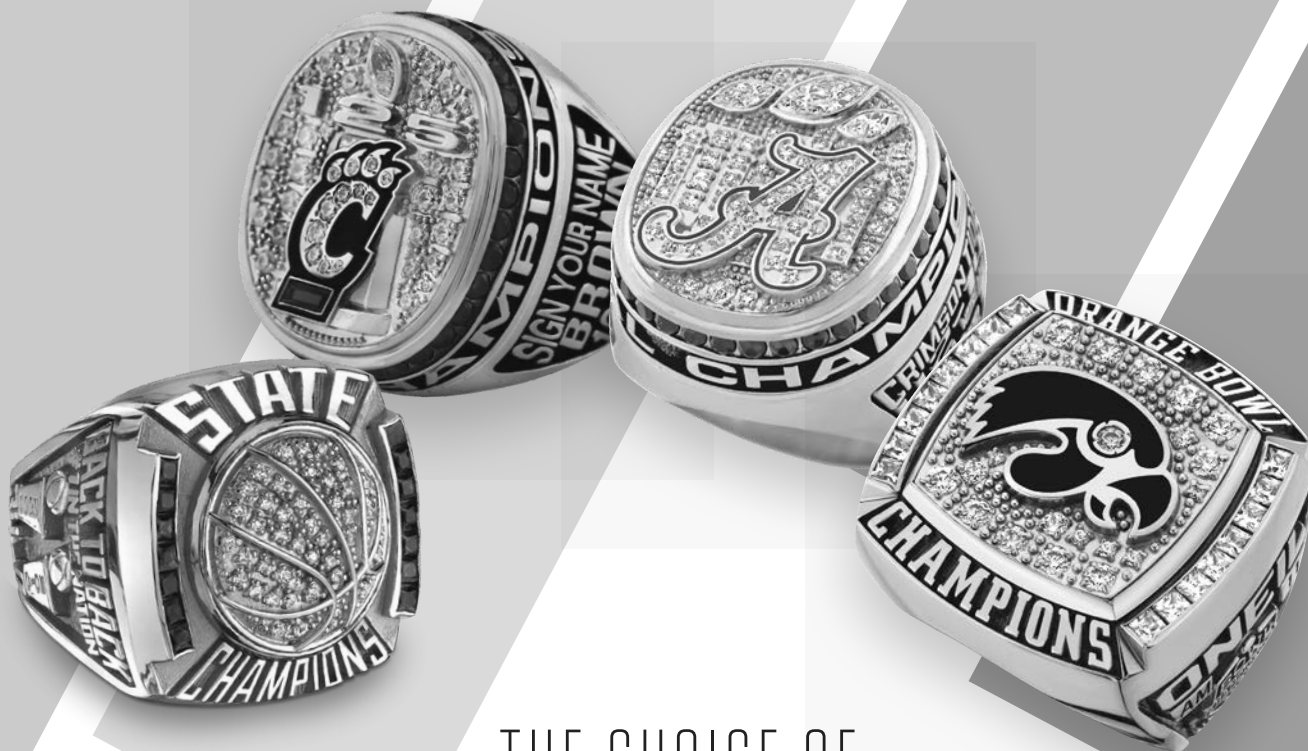

Waukee wins 4A, Pella, Western, Montezuma return to finals form

DES MOINES, Iowa – One year after COVID-19 disrupted its first sporting events and altered the world in 2020 and 2021, the IHSAA State Basketball Tournament took the court again at Wells Fargo Arena in Des Moines. The 2020 championship games were played for family and friends as the pandemic was just beginning to change daily life and mass gatherings. Precautions and preparations had come a long way in Iowa, and the 2021 tournament was played as scheduled, albeit with consolation games gone in an adjusted schedule and capacity limits allowing for around 5,000 socially-distanced fans into seating groups around the arena. The basketball was back to feeling somewhat normal, even if everything off the court wasn't entirely there yet.

Spectators got a sensational tournament, with close games and star players in each classification. That was capped in finals on Friday, March 12 with Waukee finally winning its first basketball title, and Pella, Western Christian, and Montezuma showcasing their skills and taking championships back to their proud trophy cases.

CLASS 4A: Waukee dominated their three days on the court at Wells Fargo Arena, showcasing one of the longest and most talented rosters the tournament had seen in years. Coach Justin Ohl's squad opened the tournament with a 33-5 lead on Pleasant Valley in the quarterfinals and proceeded to roll past CIML foes Ames and Johnston to the title. The Dragons held an early 12-point lead before Waukee's three All-Tournament Team players - Payton Sandfort, Tucker DeVries, and Omaha Biliew - took over.



Montezuma had finished in the consolation round in the previous two state tournaments, but won three thrilling contests at the 2021 tournament to win their first championship since 1990.

CLASS 3A: Pella won its first championship since 2003 as the highest-scoring squad in 3A poured in enough points to work past Monticello, Sergeant Bluff-Luton, and top-seeded Ballard over four days. The Dutch and coach Derek Schulte won the program's third title while being paced by All-Tournament Team captain Grant Nelson and a balanced lineup, including 41 points over three games from substitute Noah Allen.

CLASS 2A: The state championship came down to a showdown between two schools sitting just a few blocks apart in the small northwest Iowa town of Hull. Through district and substate rounds, then even state tournament seeding, Boyden-Hull and Western Christian, Hull remained separate. In the final, the two powerhouse programs collided for the first time since the 2005 postseason and for the first time ever at the state tournament. Western's Ty Van Essen provided a title-worthy spark with 32 points and 12 rebounds in the final as the Wolfpack won their 10th championship.

CLASS 1A: Montezuma entered a loaded 1A field seeded No. 7 and used that perceived slight to push past unbeaten Lake Mills, parochial power and three-time champion Grand View Christian, then unbeaten and high-octane North Linn for the championship. The Braves used elite guard play through All-Tournament Team picks Trey Shearer and Cole Watts, and leaned on Eddie Burgess in the post to pick up their wins. Montezuma's previous two titles came in 1971 and 1990. North Linn was appearing in its fourth straight title game.



Assumption, Davenport senior Emariel Ellis was a star performer at his first state tournament, scoring 25 points in the quarterfinals and 33 to pace the Knights in the Class 3A semifinals.
