

How to: Activate Your School Page, Add Players & Post Scores

1. **Create Free Personal Profile:** <https://app.universaltennis.com/join>
2. **Activate High School:** <https://app.universaltennis.com/highschool>
3. **Add Team Roster**
 - a. **If players already have a claimed Universal Tennis profile** - Search for them by choosing "Add Players" on your team page. Type in your player's name in the "Search Existing Players" bar. Choose "Next" when finding your player, "Select Their Graduation Year" and "Add member" to your roster.
 - b. **If players have an unclaimed Universal Tennis profile:** The player's name appears when searching for them, but still asks to "Invite New Player." Type in the player's email address to invite them to roster. This means the player has NOT claimed their profile and still needs to do so. The player will not appear on roster until the player has accepted the invite by creating a free profile.
 - c. **If players do not have a Universal Tennis profile:** Choose "Add Players" on team page, choose "Invite New Player" and type in the player's email address to invite them to roster. Player will not appear on roster until the player has accepted the invite by creating a free profile.
4. **Post Challenge Match Scores** - Post scores for practice or challenge matches, choose "Post Scores." Posting scores helps players help build their tennis profile and showcase their game.
5. **Post Dual Match Scores**
 - a. Choose "Create Event"
 - b. Choose "Official" when asked Is this an official High School event or a fundraiser/other event?
 - c. Choose "Dual Match"
 - d. Start typing in opponent school and select
 - e. Choose "yes or no" if the dual match should be grouped in your [standings](#)?
 - f. Enter date, time, location
 - g. Choose the individual match lineups by selecting each player from the team roster - note that only players who are on the team roster will appear in the drop-down
 - h. Post scores for the individual dual matches, as well as the overall team score
6. **Run Sanctioned & Unofficial High School Tournaments** - You can use the Universal Tennis easy-to-use event management system and tournament management system to take registration, create draws and post Verified UTR scores for any official high school tournament, such as a post-season tournament. To create an event, choose "Create Event" and "Tournament".

Coach FAQ



What is the benefit of Universal Tennis for High School players?

Universal Tennis provides an equalizer for all players regardless of age, gender, national ranking or location. It is the gold standard in college recruiting and the official rating of the ITA. When players have a UTR, they know their level, can track progress, find competitive matches closer to home and even get recruited for college.



Can I benefit from playing someone with a lower UTR? Of course. Playing up or down tests different, equally important muscles that are key to developing your game. That said, UTR does not take into account matches from players with a UTR difference greater than 2.0 (unless the lower-rated player wins)



How is the rating calculated? UTR is an objective, results-driven rating based on: 1) Strength of opponent; 2) Games won; 3) History of last 30 matches within 12 months. It does not look at wins or losses.



How does UTR affect players who have never played tennis before?

After one match result a player will have a UTR. After 4-5 match results a player's UTR becomes more reliable.



How does UTR work for doubles play? Players have both a singles UTR and a separate doubles UTR.



What is the difference between UTR & Verified UTR? They are two different ratings. UTR measures all play, including practice, challenge matches and self-posted scores. Verified UTR only measures Verified UTR matches, including sanctioned high school tournaments and dual matches, USTA results, and other federations & partner results.

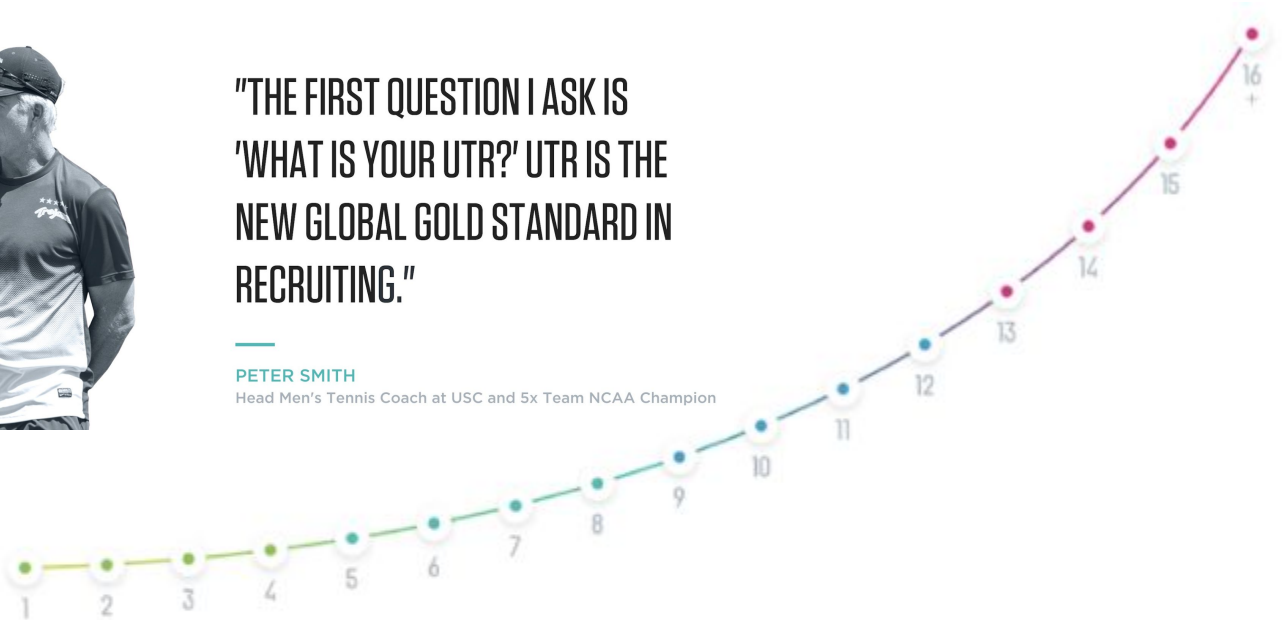
